- 5. This story is an example for our church organization today. Explain:

Let people who have the gifts of service and mercy be responsible for that ministry, while those who have the gifts of preaching and teaching do their ministry.

Choose people for ministry who are mature, faithful, and gifted by the Holy Spirit; don't simply accept volunteers.

5. During Paul's and Barnabas' return trip home, what did they do for the Christians that that they previously visited?

Paul and Barnabas encouraged them, appointed elders for the churches, prayed for them (Acts 14:22-23).

6. Their first mission journey ended where? Back in Antioch in Syria (Acts 14:26-28)

LESSON 28 The Jerusalem Council

Read Acts 15:1-35.

1. What conflict arose in Antioch?

Some men came from Judea to Antioch and told the Gentiles that them that in order to be saved, they must become circumcised and follow Jewish traditiosn. (Acts 15:1)

- 2. The Apostles and leaders in Jerusalem had a meeting. Who led that meeting? *James, the brother of Jesus (Acts 15:13)*
- 3. What did they decide? (Or more accurately: What did they learn that God decided?) Gentiles do not need to be circumcised or follow Jewish traditions (Acts 15:19)

Barnabas and Mark went west to Cyprus (Acts 15:39).

- Paul went where? ...with whom?
 Paul and Silas went north through Syria and Cilicia (Acts 15:40-41).
- 4. Timothy lived where?

Lystra (Acts 16:1)

5. What does the Bible tell us about Timothy's family?

Timothy's mother was Eunice, a Jew; Timothy's grandmother was Lois. Both women were strong believers and they taught Timothy the Scriptures (2 Timothy 1:5). But Timothy's father was an unbelieving Greek and he did not permit Timothy to become circumcised (Acts 16:3).

- 5. While Paul was in Corinth, he wrote two letters to Christians in another city. Where was that other city?

Thessalonica (see video)

- 6. What lessons does this story have for us today?
 - a. God wants us to work and not be lazy.
 - b. Even though people try to stop the Gospel, God gives His Word success.

LESSON 35 Apollos

Read Acts 18:18-27.

1. Who was Apollos? What was his special gift/ability?

Apollos was a well from Alexandria, Egypt. He knew the Old Testament scriptures very well, he was a good teacher, and he knew about Jesus. (Acts 18:24)

- 2. His teaching missed something very important. What? Jesus' crucifixion, suffering, death, and resurrection. (Acts 18:25)
- 3. Who taught Apollos the full story about Jesus? *Priscilla and Aquila (Acts 18:26)*
- 4. What lessons does this story have for us today?

It is not enough to simply know about Jesus. True faith means knowing Him and trusting Him for life and salvation.

LESSON 36 Disciples of John the Baptist

Read Acts 19:1-10.

- 1. Paul met disciples of John the Baptist, where? *Ephesus (Acts 19:1-3)*
- 2. What did they NOT receive in John's baptism? *The Holy Spirit (Acts 19:2)*
- 3. Paul stayed in Ephesus how long?

Between two and three years (Acts 19:10 and 20:31)

4. Explain the differences between: (*Please watch the video*.)

John's baptism	The baptism Jesus received from John	Christian baptism
Connected the baptized people to Old Testament Israel passing through the Red Sea to come under God's covenant.	Connected Jesus to our sins, as this was a baptism for repentance.	Connects us to Jesus' death and resurrection (Romans 6)

LESSON 37 Seven Sons of Sceva

Read Acts 19:11-20.

1. Who were the seven sons of Sceva?

Sceva was a Jewish high priest. His seven sons were exorcists (they tried to cast demons out of people) in Ephesus (Acts 19:13-14)

2. They tried using Jesus' name how? ...and why?

They had seen Paul perform miracles and cast out demons in Jesus' name, so they tried to do the same thing. They tried to cast a demon out of man by saying, "In the name of Jesus, whom Paul preaches, I command you to come out." (Acts 19:11-14)

3. Using Jesus' name didn't work for them. Why?

They did not trust in Jesus. They did not know Him. They had no authority for using Jesus' name. (Acts 19:15)

4. What happened to them?

The demon possessed man attacked them, and beat them up badly (Acts 19:16).

5. After Christian people in Ephesus heard about this, what did they do?

They confessed their secret sins and brought out their occult scrolls and burned them (Acts 19:17-20)

- 6. What lessons does this story have for us today?
 - a. In order to have the blessings of Christ, we must know Him and trust Him. We cannot treat Him like a good luck charm.
 - b. We cannot be followers of Christ and play around with the occult at the same time.

LESSON 38 Demetrius the Silversmith

Read:

Acts 19:21-41 Matthew 16:13-18

1. The city of Ephesus had a temple for which Greek god?

Artemis (Acts 19:35)

2. Who was Demetrius?

A silversmith who earned his money making miniature shrines and idols of Artemis (Act 19:24)

- He was angry about Paul, why?
 People were turning away from idols to trust Jesus (Acts 19:26)
- 4. While Paul was in Ephesus, he wrote letters to Christians in what city? *Corinth (see video)*
- 5. Paul sent his helpers to Greece to collect money for whom? *Christians in Jerusalem and Judea*
- 6. What lesson does this story have for us today? *The devil will oppose us when we tell people about Jesus.*

LESSON 39 Eutychus

Read Acts 20:1-12.

- 1. As Paul left Corinth, he changed his travel plans. Why? *People were planning to kill him (Acts 20:3)*
- 2. How many people travelled with Paul? *Eight, including Luke (Acts 20:4-5)*
- 3. Eutychus lived where?

Troas (Acts 20:6, 9)

4. What happened to Eutychus?

He fell asleep while Paul was preaching and he fell out of a third story window. The fall killed him, but when Paul threw himself on Eutychus, God brought him back to life again. (Acts 20:9)

Acts 20:13-38 Revelation 2:1-7

- Paul expected something to happen to him in Jerusalem. What?
 Paul expected that he would be killed in Jerusalem (Acts 20:23-25)
- 2. Paul met with who?where?

The elders (pastors) of the church in Ephesus (Acts 20:17)

3. Paul gave them a warning about what?

False teachers in their own group (Acts 20:29-31)

- 4. In Revelation 2:1-7 we see how well they followed Paul's warning. Explain what happened. They held on to God's Word and they rejected false teachers. But they also lost the love that they had in the beginning.
- 5. What lesson does this have for us today?

The church must always stand for the authority and truth of God's Word and reject all error, and we must also love God and show His love and mercy to people.

LESSON 41 Paul arrested in Jerusalem

Read Acts 21 & 22.

- In Caesarea, Paul and his team visited whose home? *Philip (Acts 21:8)*
- 2. Agabus did what to show that Paul will be arrested?

Agabus tied Paul's belt around his own hands and feet. Agabus said, "The Jews in Jerusalem will tie the owner of this belt." (Acts 21:11)

3. People in Jerusalem gossiped lies about Paul. What?

They said that Paul taught Jewish people in other countries to reject Moses and don't circumcise their sons. (Act 21:21)

4. The Apostles in Jerusalem asked Paul to do what?

Go to the temple with other members of the church and follow the Jewish tradition for making himself religiously clean. (Acts 21:24, 26)

- The Jewish people in the temple accused Paul of doing what?
 Bringing a Gentile into the Jerusalem temple (Acts 21:28). [This was also false.]
- 6. One word that Paul said in his message to the people upset them. What? *"Gentiles" (Acts 22:21-22)*
- The Roman officer his soldier to whip Paul. Why did the soldier stop? Paul told him that he is Roman citizen (Acts 22:25-26)
- 8. How did Paul become a Roman citizen?*Paul was born a citizen, as the son of Roman citizen (Acts 22:28)*

LESSON 42 Paul's Trial in Jerusalem

Read Acts 22:30 – 23:11.

- 1. The Jewish court had two groups of people. Who were they:
 - a. Sadducees
 - b. Pharisees
- 2. Those two groups were different, how?
 - a. Sadducees accepted only the first five books of the Old Testament. They did not believe in angels, spirits, life after death, or the resurrection.
 - b. Pharisees accepted the whole Old Testament. The believed in angels, spirits, life after death, and the resurrection.
- 3. Before Paul trusted Jesus, he belonged to which group?

Pharisees (Acts 23:6)

4. Paul got those two groups to fight against each other, how?

Paul said, "I am a Pharisee... I am on trial because of my hope in the resurrection from the dead." (Acts 23:6)

5. Later Paul realized that trick was a mistake. Why? Paul took control and he did not honor Christ (see Acts 24:21).

LESSON 43 Paul's 2nd trial

Read Acts 23:12 – 24:27.

- The Roman army officer secretly moved Paul out of Jerusalem during the night. Why? A group of 40 men secretly planned to kill Paul (Acts 23:12-22)
- 2. They moved Paul what city?

Caesarea (Acts 23:23)

3. Governor Felix keep Paul in prison for two years. Why?

Felix wanted to please the Jewish religious leaders, and he wanted Paul to pay him a bribe (Acts 24:26-27).

4. Paul had a friend with him that may have used those two years for doing important work that touches us today. Who was that friend? ...and what was his profession (work)?

Luke, a medical doctor, may have used the two years time that Paul was in prison to do his research to write the Gospel of Luke.

LESSON 44 Paul Defends His Civil Rights

Read Acts 25 & 26.

 - a. In Philippi, when Paul and Silas were beaten and thrown into jail without a trial (Acts 16:37)

- In Acts 25, why did Paul need to defend on his citizen rights?
 Governor Festus offered to send Paul back to Jerusalem for trial (Act 25:9-11)

 Paul said, "I appeal to Caesar!" (Acts 25:11)
- 4. After Paul stood on his rights, Governor Festus had a problem. What was that problem? *Festus did not have anything to write to Caesar, explaining Paul's "crime." (Acts 25:26)*
- 5. What is the name of the Roman Emperor? *Nero*

6. What lesson does the story have for us today?

The government must respect and protect every citizen's civil rights, including the right of Christians. As Christians, we are entitled to hold people in authority accountable.

- What is the name of the Roman army officer responsible for taking Paul to Rome? Julius (Acts 27:1)
- 2. Two of Paul's friends travelled with him to Rome. What are their names? Aristarchus and Luke (Acts 27:2)

 14 (Acts 27:27)
- 4. How many people were on the ship?276 (Acts 27:37)
- 5. How many people died? None (Acts 27:44)
- 6. Is there a time when God protected you through serious danger? Explain.

LESSON 46 Malta

Read Acts 28:1-10.

- A poisonous snake bit Paul. As that happened, what did the people of Malta say about Paul? They said, "This mas must be a murderer." (Acts 28:4)
- 2. As Paul did not die from the snake bite, then what did the people say about him? *They said that Paul was a god (Acts 28:6)*

3. Who was Publius?

The chief official on the island (Acts 28:7)

- 4. What did Paul do for Publius and his family? *Pray for Publius' sick father, which healed him (Acts 28:8)*
- How long were Paul and his friends stuck on that little island?
 3 months (Acts 28:11)
- 6. During that time, what did Paul do for the people of the island? *Heal the other sick people on the island (Acts 28:9)*
- 7. What lessons does this story have for us today?

Again we see that God changes our plans in order to His work. No place, no person, no situation is unimportant to God.

 - (a) Onesimus is a spiritual picture about us. We were under God's holy authority. But we rebelled. and ran away. We sold ourselves as slaves to sin. The Devil became ours master. But Christ has freed us from the devil, paying for our freedom with His precious blood. Now Christ forgives us, and welcomes us back, not as slaves, but as brothers and sisters.
 - (b) Paul gave Philemon a hard challenge: Forgive Onesimus and welcome him as a brother. God also gives us that same hard challenge: Forgive those who hurt us and welcome them as brothers and sisters, as Christ forgives and welcomes us.
 - (c) The world divides people into upper and lower classes. God sees all people equal. The world divides people into groups and labels them as "races." God made only one human race. All people are cousins from the same parents.
