Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Welcome to Detroit, the birthplace of the first Deaf Institute in the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. You have much to celebrate this year: the 27th biennial celebration of the International Lutheran Deaf Association (ILDA) and the 129th anniversary of Deaf Ministry in the LCMS. We are honored that you chose to celebrate it in Michigan.

- In 1873, the Evangelical Lutheran Orphanage and Deaf Institute was established in Detroit.
- The first pastor was Rev. G. Speckhardt.
- Within ten months of him settling in Royal Oak, 15 Deaf children were brought to him.
- Because an orphanage had been built in the Chicago area, the Detroit Institute became dedicated exclusively to the Deaf.
- The Deaf students were taught German until 1899, when the switch to English took place.
- The Institute stayed abreast of the newest educational methods—it was one of the first to use the oral method, teaching the children to speak and read lips.
- Lutheran services for the Deaf in the Detroit area started in 1896. One member invited others and the number increased to twelve. By 1910, a congregation of 16 voting members (then shepherded by Rev. Arthur Boll) was officially organized under the name *Congregation of Our Savior Lutheran Church of the Deaf*.
- By 1917, under Rev. Otto Schroeder, membership had increased to 50.
- Our Savior reached its peak in the 1950s, with more than 300 communicant members.
- The ministry to the Deaf was eventually moved out of Detroit to St. Paul, Royal Oak in 1990.

As I read through this history, I can't help but notice the themes of relationships, service to others, and God's faithfulness. Which brings us to the theme of your convention: *"For it has been granted to you that for the sake of Christ you should not only believe in him but also suffer for his sake" (1 Peter 3:15 NKJV)*. Thanks be to God that so many Deaf people have been brought to faith through these ministries in Detroit and around the United States and the world.

May God bless your time together here, strengthening you to keep *Defending Our Faith* in all languages and all nations.

Word of God Lutheran Church for the Deaf is located in Cedar Rapids with preaching stations in Davenport, Dubuque, Burlington, and Waterloo. He is currently also the vacancy pastor for Calvary Lutheran Church for the Deaf in Des Moines. As a board member of the Lutheran Deaf Mission Society, he is responsible for working with Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, to make classes accessible for Deaf pastoral and deaconess students.

Rev. Eckert is married to Susan (Friedmann), a native of Peosta, Iowa. God has blessed them with three children, Stephen, Rachel and Sarah.

Gregory has worked as an associate pastor to Rev. David Nielsen since Gregory was ordinated in 2013. As dual citizen of Canada and the United States, he taught History, Government and Social Studies at the secondary level in the Iowa School for the Deaf for fourteen years and the British Columbia School for the Deaf until 2021. He taught at the schools and universities for forty-three years. Additionally, as a full-time retiree, he has been called to teach, to preach and to listen to and advise the unfortunate and desperate deaf people in a capacity of mentor and client in spiritual ways.

Edwin Lot Bergstresser was born in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania, on April 4, 1955. He was born deaf and attended the Pennsylvania School for the Deaf in Philadelphia from 1961-1970. He transferred to the Model Secondary School for the Deaf in Washington, D.C. and graduated in 1974. He went to Community College of Philadelphia for two years and then transferred to Gallaudet University. He received a Bachelor of Arts in Social Work degree in 1979. He went to Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri, to become a pastor to the deaf. He graduated with a Master of Divinity degree in May 1984. He was a student pastor under Rev. Roy Dahmann in Bay Area, California during 1982-1983. He married his wife, Nancy, who is also deaf on August 23, 1980. He and his wife had a foster son, Anand Victor Raj from India. They had four sons, Daniel, John, Matthew and (an adopted) Aaron. Pastor Ed was a pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church of the Deaf, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania from 1984 to 1994. Now he is a pastor to Holy Cross Lutheran Church of the Deaf, Columbus, Ohio from 1994 to present. He is now semiretired. He is an executive director of Lutheran Deaf Mission Society since 2023.

Biography of Speakers



David S. Bush

David (73) was born in 1950, on a crop and sheep farm near Tecumseh, Michigan. His father is the late Rev. Leland E. Bush (a minister to the deaf), and his mother, Margaret I. Bush (95). David attended, Concordia, Ann Arbor (A.A.), Concordia, Chicago (B.A. in Elementary Education), Concordia Theological Seminary in Springfield/Fort Wayne (M. Div. 1978). His vicarage supervisors were the Rev. Robert Muller in Washington, D.C. and Baltimore and the Rev. Dr. Daniel H. Pokorny at Gallaudet University. David met Barbara J. Actis (his wife) at Gallaudet. He also had a hearing vicarage under Rev. Philip Yang at True Light Chinese Mission in Chinatown, New York City. David served as pastor to the deaf at *Eternal Mercy Church for the Deaf*, Memphis (1978-89); St. John Church for the Deaf, Fort Wayne (1989-2004). He also served two hearing churches, Good Shepherd (Memphis) and Holy Cross (Fort Wayne). He taught "Deaf Ministry and Missions" at Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, (1989-2004). He was on the staff of the Church Interpreter Training Institute (CITI, 1986-2004). David just retired from the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod OIM (2014-2024) as a career missionary to the deaf in Asia spending most of his time at the Lutheran School for the Deaf in Hong Kong. David served as a chaplain in the Air National Guard for twenty years and retired at the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. He taught at two other colleges. He continues to serve as president of the board for Concordia School for Special Education in Macau. He plans to finish his Doctor of Ministry at Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne.
