Dedication

Rev. Arnold Jonas was born January 4, 1912, to Professor Herman Jonas, Professor at Concordia Lutheran College in Oakland, California, and Ethel Jonas, nee Clausen.

He attended Trinity Lutheran Grammar School through 8th grade, receiving daily religious instruction, and was confirmed in Trinity Lutheran Church of Oakland, on Palm Sunday 1927.

For six years he attended Concordia Lutheran College in Oakland, completing four years of High School and two years of College work in preparation for the ministry. Upon graduation in 1931, Rev. Jonas went to Concordia Lutheran Seminary in St. Louis, Missouri, and graduated in June 1935.

January, 1936, Rev. Jonas served two Mission Congregations of hearing people in Colorado in the towns of Canyon City and Salida.

July 18th, 1936, he married Alberta M. Staton of Napa, California, in St. John's Lutheran Church in Napa.

September 1937, a call was sent to serve the Deaf Congregations in South Dakota. Rev. Jonas spent the last three months of 1937 with Dr. George Gaertner of Oakland, learning sign language and finger spelling.

January 10, 1938, he was ordained and commissioned by Rev. E. Mappes of Omaha, Nebraska, as missionary to the deaf in South Dakota. Rev. Jonas served there four years and in January 1942, he went to serve the Deaf congregations in Seattle, Washington. After six years in Washington, Rev. Jonas was called to Los Angeles, California, where he was installed on October 10, 1948, by Dr. George Gaertner, in Grace Lutheran Church. He has served in Los Angeles, as Missionary to the Deaf, until his retirement on January 4th, 1977.

Reverend Jonas and Mrs. Jonas have four children: Julie Ann Dalby, Ted M. Jonas, Christin Ethel Maleske and Tom A. Jonas.

Rev. Jonas has had many achievements in his 33 years of ministry in Los Angeles. The two of the most important are:

- 1. He established a new church for the deaf in May 1960.
- 2. He founded the Pilgrim Towers in June 1968, a housing facility for deaf and hearing persons both young and elderly.

HISTORY OF DEAF MISSIONS IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

1. Exploratory Trips May 19, 1912 - Rev. Arthur L. Reinke peached the first sermon and church service in Trinity Lutheran Church July, 1914 - Rev. T. Wangerin, of Milwaukee explores Los Angeles and the West Coast.

Both men report a need for full time.

- Rev. N. F. Jensen November, 1914 to April 26, 1926 First full time missionary on the west coast. First lived in Oakland, preached in Los Angeles once month -moved to Los Angeles in October 1915 twice a month services. He was called to St. John's Church, Orange in September, 1917. Continued with two services a month for the deaf until April 26, 1926.
- 3. Rev. Gerhard Ferber Easter 1927 to July 1948. February 20, 1933 Pilgrim Lutheran Church for the Deaf became organized congregation with its first officers.
- 4. Rev. Walter D. Uhlig September 20, 1942 to April, 1948. Pilgrim Lutheran Church for the Deaf Incorporated under California Law May 29, 1946. Accepted as a member of the Southern California District of the Luthern Church - Missouri Synod, June 24, 1946.

Purchased old Fifth Avenue Lutheran Church (Pastor Coiner), held first church service for the deaf in their own building October 20, 1946. Rev. William Reinking served a summer vicarage in 1948.

- 5. Rev. Arnold Jonas October 10, 1948 to January, 1977. October 16, 1949 Rededication Service for the remodeled church building.
- 6. Rev. William Lange September 19, 1954 installed and ordained as assistant Pastor at Pilgrim Lutheran Church for the Deaf.

December, 1957 purchased the property for a new church site (five parcels) on Vermont Avenue at Pico Boulevard in Los Angeles.

July 27, 1958 - Ground breaking ceremonies at the new site.

April 26, 1959 - Cornerstone setting ceremonies.

May 19, 1959 - Dedication of the new church - Pilgrim Lutheran for the Deaf.

Rev. William Lange called to Denver, Colorado in the fall of 1959.

 Rev. Gerhard A. Gehrs, a St. Louis Seminary graduate was installed as Assistant Pastor at Pilgrim, September, 1960.

August, 1961 Southern California Field is divided, Rev. Arnold Jonas serving Pilgrim Church, the Los Angeles Area to Northern Area (Palmdale, Lancaster, and Santa Barbara).

Rev. G.A. Gehrs serving Anaheim, Riverside, and San Diego, including the State School for the Deaf in Riverside with over 500 children in attendance at the school.

- 8. Rev. Stanley Behrends after passing a colloquy program under Synod's supervision was installed as Assistant Pastor at Pilgrim on January 30, 1966. He resigned October 22, 1966.
- 9. Mr. Don Fairman, graduate of L.L.T.I. Milwaukee, Wisconsin was assigned to Pilgrim as a layworker assistant, July 1968 to November 1969.

Pilgrim Tower opened June 1968 - a thirteen story high-rise apartment building, primary for elderly deaf people, government financed under section 202 of H.E.W. - adajcent to Pilgrim Church - sponsored by a daughter corporation of Pilgrim Church, Pilgrim Senior Citizen's Housing Development Corporation.

- 10. Rev. Leroy Mason January 19, 1969 to April 22, 1973 served as Pastor of Pilgrim Lutheran Church of the Deaf, while Rev. Arnold Jonas served full time Pilgrim Tower Chaplain and the elderly Deaf of Los Angeles.
- 11. Rev. August Hauptman serving as pastor of the Pilgrim Lutheran Church of the Deaf since August 19, 1978 until present time.
