Rev. Quintin Quade

Born: Hastings, Nebraska, in 1936, raised on the farm by his mother and grandmother.

Served: With U.S. Army, being the secretary-stenographer in the office of the U.S. Commander, Berlin, and in the Intelligence Division of Berlin Brigade from 1960-62.

Graduated: Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO. in 1965.

Married: Dorothy Kieser on December 27, 1964, and had two sons, John ('65) and Timothy ('68).

Ministry: Four years at two hearing churches in North Dakota. Accepted the call to the Deaf Congregation which worshiped at Trinity, Cedar Rapids, IA., and was installed on Feb. 16, 1969. He served a period of in-service training from Feb. to Aug. with Pastor BENGELALORF in order to refresh the sign language and to become familiar with deaf work in Iowa. On Dec. 28 East Iowa Deaf Lutherans organized a field congregation, called Word of God Lutheran Church for the Deaf.

Event: Attended the First ILDA Convention at Regency Hyatt House — Chicago — July 16-19, 1971. For some who may not remember, Pastor Quade wasn't feeling good there. He stated he would see the doctor when returning home. He attended the hospital in August.

Death: Passed away from cancer on Nov. 10, 1971. He was 35 while his sons — John was 6 and Timothy was 3.

Now Up To Date: Mother — Rena, 88, still lives at Hastings on the home farm. Wife — Dorothy still resides at the same house in Cedar Rapids, very active in her church and often babysits a little girl. Son — John 22, is not sure which college, but probably will study journalism and photography when he does go to college. Son — Timothy, 19, is planning also on attending college next fall, not sure which college at this time.

Quintin Quade was the pastor of Word of God Church. It was later changed to the "LAMPLIGHTER." In our October '86 Voters' meeting we changed the name back to the "THE SIGN POST."

HISTORY OF WORD OF GOD

- 1894 The first sermon in sign language to the deaf in the Lutheran Church was preached in Chicago by Rev. A. Reinke in 1894. Because of the wide open field and the need for such a ministry the work grew rapidly.
- 1921 Rev. E. Mappes came to Omaha, Nebraska and also served the Kansas City field together with Iowa and Nebraska. When other men were called to take over the Kansas City and South Dakota field, Rev. Mappes began to concentrate his efforts in Iowa and Nebraska.
- 1938 Rev. Mappes visited the only city, Cedar Rapids, in Iowa East. For many years Trinity congregation provided facilities for these services.
- 1955 Rev. Victor Mesenbrink was called to become the first resident pastor to the deaf in Des Moines and traveled regularly to Cedar Rapids, Mason City, Cedar Falls, Burlington and Rock Island, IL.

1969 -- Now History - Word of God

Rev. Quintin Quade came to Cedar Rapids and became the first fulltime resident pastor to serve the Iowa District East. In 1969 the Iowa East deaf Lutherans voted to form a church and call themselves Word of God Lutheran Church for the Deaf, with headquarters in Cedar Rapids but with members and schedule of services also in Rock Island, IL, Burlington, Dubuque, Monticello, Clinton and Muscatine.

- 1971-'73 Following the death of Rev. Quade in 1971, a long vacancy ensued, during which Rev. Richard Thompson of Trinity congregation served Word of God.
- 1973 Rev. Allan Page became the pastor in 1973.
- 1974 In 1974 the present church building was purchased and has been extensively equipped for the unique ministry to the deaf.
- 1976-'77 When Pastor Page left in 1976 the congregation was vacant again and Pastor Thompson of Trinity once more served as interim pastor.
- 1977-'81 In 1977 Word of God called lay minister Marion Van Manen and he served until 1981.
- 1981 Rev. Thompson of Trinity was the vacancy pastor again for a few months until new candidate, David Mueller, was installed Sept. 13, 1981.
- 1981-'86 Rev. David Mueller had 99 souls and 73 communicants during his five years in our parish. There were some events during his time:

In 1982 Word of God received a "Forward in Remembrance" grant to purchase videotape equipment to supplement the outreach to the preaching stations. Each week Bible studies and worship services in Cedar Rapids are taped. The tapes are then sent to the stations. Each preaching station has a video player used in a member's home where the members gather to learn and to worship. The video players are now being used in Dubuque, Clinton, Quad Cities, Ottumwa, Burlington and Oelwein.

In 1984 we had a special worship in celebrating our congregation as 15th anniversary at about the same time to celebrate our 10th anniversary of our church building. Rev. A. L. Barry was our special speaker.

- In 1985 Rev. Mueller got us a new computer system.
- 1986 After Easter, 1986, Rev. Mueller left, we had several new candidates and had to wait for one of them for several months.
- 1986 April-June Rev. Daniel Johnson from King of Kings Lutheran Church was our vacancy pastor for a while. Linda Buckley was our interpreter during the worship services.
- 1986 June New Candidate, Mike MacDonald, our present pastor, was installed June 29, 1986.

BANNER EXPLANATION

ECCLESIASTES 3:1-8

It is assumed that King Solomon wrote the Book of Ecclesiastes. In the first half of Ecclesiastes, (Chapters 1-6), King Solomon wrote about things being foolish, without value, worthless. The words, "All is vanity" repeats the thought of foolishness, and worthlessness of earthly things. The second half of Ecclesiastes, (Chapters 7-11), talks about wisdom and comfort in times of suffering. King Solomon's idea of Ecclesiastes is written in chapter 12:14: "Fear God and keep His commandments," to persuade people to not have confidence in world treasures.

THE CROSS

The Cross at the top of the banner reminds us that all scriptures point us to Christ Jesus who suffered on the Cross.

THE RAYS

The gold rays from the Cross show the glory and blessings Christ Jesus won for us on the Cross. The blessings of Jesus shine as a light in our dark world.

THE HOUR GLASS

The hour glass in the center of the circles represents time — there is a time for everything. There is a proper time for God to do things.

THE CIRCLES

The 12 circles point to the time of day with each circle containing a picture of the things spoken in Ecclesiastes 3:2-8.

THE ARROWS

The arrows point to the circles from the hour glass meaning there is a right time for each picture. The circles opposite each other — following the arrows show opposite meanings as written in Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, Peace-War, Love-Hate, Sow-Reap, etc.

The Rev. Alvin L. Barry was born at Woodine, Iowa on August 4, 1931. After graduating from high school, he attended Bethany Lutheran College, Mankato, MN, and Concordia Seminary, Springfield, IL. He completed his theological training through the Lutheran Seminary, Thiensville, WI.

through the Lutheran Seminary, Thiensville, WI. Following his ordination into the ministry in 1956, he spent eleven years serving parishes at Minneapolis, Claremont, and Trimont, Minnesota. In February of 1967, he accepted a call as Missions and Stewardship Counselor for the Iowa District West. During the next eight years he prepared numerous booklets and programs in the area of missions, stewardship and evangelism. In June of 1968 he received his Master of Theology Degree from Luther Theological Seminary, St. Paul, MN.

In the summer of 1972 he led a tour of world missions, visiting missionaries and sister church bodies in 14 countries around the globe.

On March 1, 1975, Pastor Barry assumed the position of Executive Secretary to Synod's Board of Missions. He served in this position until August of 1977 when he began work as Executive Secretary for Missions and Stewardship of the Iowa District East during which time he established the Reach Out India/Iowa Emphasis with the India Evangelical Lutheran Church.

In June of 1982 he became President of the Iowa District East and is currently serving in that capacity. In May of 1986 he was awarded an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from Concordia Seminary in Ft. Wayne, IN in recognition of his thirty years of service to the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod as a parish pastor, national and world mission leader, and church administrator.

Dr. Barry is married to Jean (nee) Heim and they reside in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. They have three children — Kris Becker of Melbourne, Florida; Beth Mikos of Cedar Rapids, and Keith of Providence, Rhode Island and one grandchild.

WHAT IS THE I.L.D.A.?

The International Lutheran Deaf Association was founded in Chicago during the first biennial convention in 1971. The purpose, according to the revised constitution, is "to coordinate and strengthen the religious activities and services in our congregation to help promote their growth to the highest possible level in service to their Lord and Savior; to promote the Christian faith and life of Lutheran Deaf people, all deaf individuals, and others with whom we associate; and to carry on our ministry throughout the world."

The I.L.D.A. shall communicate and convey to the deaf members the programs, plans, and goals of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. It shall support lay-leadership among deaf Lutherans in all areas of faith and life.

In 1975 the members voted ratification of the revised constitution. The historic document will help develop the I.L.D.A. image and facilitate the operation and administration of the association. The members also supported the goal of recruiting as many lay people as possible and getting them actively involved in the I.L.D.A. affairs.

In 1987 the aim of I.L.D.A. is to carry out the objectives of serving the Lord in His church and to obtain the financial support that would lead to self-sufficiency. It is hoped that many programs and projects for the ministry and mission of the I.L.D.A. will become a reality.

Membership in the I.L.D.A. is open to all deaf, and is divided into three categories: ACTIVE, ASSOCIATE, and SUSTAINING.

The I.L.D.A. relies on its official publication. THE DEAF LUTHERAN, to convey information of its activities and services to deaf Lutherans.

God's 1000 Club

God's 1,000 Club was established by the I.L.D.A. Board of Directors and it aims to continue to grow.

The name "God's 1,000 Club" was chosen because first of all the work of I.L.D.A. is to get the Good News of God's Son to the deaf everywhere. 1,000 represented the number of donors or club members we hope to enlist.

People who become members in God's 1,000 Club are asked to *contribute* \$10.00 *each year* thereafter. This is not a part of the regular I.L.D.A. dues and it does not pay for a subscription to *THE DEAF LUTHERAN*. Any donations given to God's 1,000 Club can only be used to help pay the expenses of I.L.D.A. board meetings.
