Even if I had the gift of faith so that I could speak to a mountain and make it move, I would still be worth nothing at all without love.

If I gave everything I have to poor people, and if I were burned alive for preaching the Gospel but didn't love others, it would be of no value whatever.

Love is very patient and kind, never jealous or envious, never boastful or proud,

Never haughty or selfish or rude. Love does not demand its own way. It is not irritable or touchy. It does not hold grudges and will hardly even notice when others do it wrong.

It is never glad about injustice, but rejoices whenever truth wins out.

If you love someone you will be loyal to him no matter what the cost. You will always believe in him, always expect the best of him, and always stand your ground in defending him.

All the special gifts and powers from God will someday come to an end, but love goes on forever. Someday prophecy, and speaking in unknown languages, and special knowledge—these gifts will disappear.

Now we know so little, even with our special gifts, and the preaching of those most gifted is still so poor.

But when we have been made perfect and complete, then the need for these inadequate special gifts will come to an end, and they will disappear.

It's like this: when I was a child I spoke and thought and reasoned as a child does. But when I became a man my thoughts grew far beyond those of my childhood, and now I have put away the childish things.

In the same way, we can see and understand only a little about God now, as if we were peering at His reflection in a poor mirror; but someday we are going to see Him in His completeness, face to face. Now all that I know is hazy and blurred, but then I will see everything clearly, just as clearly as God sees into my heart right now.

There are three things that remain—faith, hope, and love—and the greatest of these is love.

What Is The ILDA?



The International Lutheran Deaf Association (ILDA) commenced its ministry during its first biennial convention in Chicago in 1971. The purpose, according to the revised constitution is "to coordinate and strengthen the religious activities and services in our congregations to help promote their growth to the highest possible level in service to their Lord and Savior, to promote the Christian faith and life of Lutheran Deaf people, other deaf individuals and others with whom we associate; and to carry on our ministry throughout the world."

The ILDA shall communicate and convey to the deaf members, the programs, plans and goals of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. It shall support lay-leadership among deaf Lutherans in all areas of faith and life.

In 1975, the members voted on the ratification of the revised constitution. The historic document will help develop the ILDA image and facilitate the operation and administration of the association. The members also supported the goal of recruiting as many lay people as possible and getting them actively involved in ILDA affairs.

In 1987, the aim of ILDA was to carry out the objectives of serving the Lord in His church and to obtain the financial support that would lead to self-sufficiency. It was hoped that many programs and projects for the ministry and mission of the ILDA will become a reality.

Membership in the ILDA is open to all deaf, and is divided into three categories: ACTIVE, ASSOCIATE and SUSTAINING.

The ILDA relies on its official publication, THE DEAF LUTHERAN, to convey information of its activities and services to Deaf Lutherans.

As we near the end of the first 100 years of the ministry to the Deaf, the ILDA boldly faces the challenges of a new century as a completely self-supporting organization in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and will continue its mission of outreach programs wherever such opportunities exist. Our plans call for a Centennial celebration of Deaf Ministry in conjunction with the 1995 convention of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and the ILDA which will be held in Chicago, Ill.

God's 1,000 Club

God's 1,000 Club was established by the ILDA Board of Directors and it aims to continue to grow.

The name "God's 1,000 Club" was chosen because, first of all, the work of ILDA is to get the Good News of God's Son to the Deaf everywhere. 1,000 represented the number of donors or club members, we hope to enlist.

People who become members in God's 1,000 Club are asked to contribute \$10.00 each year thereafter. This is not a part of the regular ILDA dues and it does not pay for a subscription to *THE DEAF LUTHERAN*. Any donations given to God's 1,000 Club, can only be used to help pay the expenses of ILDA board meetings. * (For delails, see the ILDA treasurer)

The History of Deaf Ministry in Texas

Before The Republic of Texas joined the United States of America, it was an independent nation. One of the heroes of the Texas war for independence was Erastus Smith, known as "Deaf Smith." Because of Mr. Smith's bravery and wisdom during the war with Mexico. The Republic of Texas put Deaf Smith's picture on the \$5.00 bill and also named "Deaf Smith County" in honor of him. Texas was the only country (and now the only state) to give such a high honor to a deaf person. However, it wouldn't be until 95 years later that the Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod finally sent a missionary to serve the deaf people in the great state of Texas.

Two days before Reformation Day, 1931, the Rev. Martin Mueller was ordained and installed in Waco, Texas. His first deaf Lutheran worship service in Texas was on March 4, 1932, at Zion Lutheran Church in Dallas. From 1931 until 1939 Rev. Mueller served the deaf of Waco, Austin, San Antonio, Houston, Beaumont, Dallas, Fort Worth, and Wichita Falls, Texas and also Oklahoma City, Tulsa and Enid, Oklahoma.

From 1939 until 1942, deaf Texans were served by the Rev. Floyd Possehl, serving out of Oklahoma. Beaumont and Wichita Falls were dropped as preaching stations, but the Oklahoma School for the Deaf in Sulpher, Oklahoma, was added.

After Rev. Possehl accepted a call out of the area, Texas and Oklahoma were served very briefly by a Rev. Striet who served the field from Oklahoma City, and Rev. Theo Delaney who served from Austin.

In August of 1953, the Rev. Ervin Oermann was installed in Austin to serve the deaf people of texas and the schools for the deaf in Louisiana and Mississppi. The Oklahoma field was separated from the Texas field for a few years, but Rev. Oermann did serve Oklahoma during their vacancy. It was during Rev. Oermann's ministry that the property on Newton Avenue was purchased (1958), and the sculpture of the sign for "Jesus" was made. It was also during this time that the congregation in Austin was named "Jesus Lutheran Church of the Deaf."

In August 1961, Rev. Herbert Rohe was installed in Houston to serve the deaf of Texas and Oklahoma. During his ministry in Texas, Rev. Rohe began to work at the Austin State Hospital and at the Texas Blind, Deaf and Orphan School.

From 1964 to 1976, Austin was served by the Rev. Donald Haug from Houston.

In 1976, Rev. Richard Reinap was installed in Austin as the first full-time resident pastor to serve primarily the Central Texas area. In 1980, a new building was constructed on the Newton Avenue property to house the congregation of Jesus Lutheran Church of the Deaf. Rev. Reinap served in Austin until 1986.

In December of 1988, Rev. Michael King was installed as the 2nd full-time pastor to serve Jesus Lutheran Church of the Deaf. Rev. King served in Austin through July 1990.

In October 1990, Rev. Mark Seeger from Rochester, N.Y. was called to be the pastor of Jesus Lutheran Church of the Deaf. He was installed in January of 1991 as the third full-time pastor to serve this congregation.

A Brief History of Dixie Deaf Lutheran Conference

DDLC covers the southern region of the United States namely Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Texas.

- 1950 Nine states including North Carolina were added as missionary fields. Several pastors traveled to preaching stations including Francis Gyle, Delbert Thies, Martin Sampson and W.A. Westermann.
- 1968 DDLC constitution was adopted on June, 1968.
- 1979 5th Biennial Convention of ILDA, June 22-24, 1979 at Holiday Inn, Memphis, Tennessee; The Theme was "Go and Tell."
- 1982 North Carolina joined in the Eastern Region International Lutheran Deaf Association (ER-ILDA)
- 1986 DDLC Conference, October 10-12, 1986 at Camp Lone Star Retreat Center, La Grange, Texas; Called for a updated version of DDLC constitution.

1988 DDLC Conference, October 14-16, 1988, Indian Springs Campground in Kosciusko, Mississppi; the theme was "Church Growth: Our Unity for Christ." Accomplishments: DDLC constituion was approved. Leadership Training Program - worshop leaders: Beth Firnhaber Lockard - "Teaching Child"

Leadership Training Program - worshop leaders: Beth Firnhaber Lockard - "Teaching Children Scripture & Faith;" Charles Kotal - "Responsibilities of Church Officers;" Rev. David Bush -"Personal Evangelism."

- 1990 DDLC TALK, the regional newsletter, was published.
- 1990 DDLC conference, September 14-16, 1990 at the Lutheran Camp on Petit Jean in Morrilton, Arkansas; The Theme was "How can the Deaf Better serve the Lord?" Sent two books about deafness as memorial gifts to Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Missouri in memory of Dr. Daniel Pokorny.
- 1992 DDLC conference, January 3-5, 1992 at Camp Lone Star Retreat Center, La Grange, Texas; Rev. Mark Anderson and Dr. Rodney Rynearson were the workshop leaders.
