The Ashland Deaf Bible Class was formed in 1993 when Mike and Cathy Alznauer moved to Ashland, Ohio. Soon after their arrival, they met Jeff Baker. He introduced them to members of the Deaf community in the Ashland area.

Several of these Deaf people began attending a hearing church where they met Kathy Geething and Paula Keener. It was at this church that Mike and Cathy began a Deaf Bible study.

#### CHRIST LUTHERAN CHURCH OF THE DEAF'S HISTORY ....

**Began in 1909-** The sainted Rev. Arthur Boll was the first Lutheran pastor to serve the deaf in Cleveland on a regular basis. He rode the train from Toledo, then headquarters of the Ohio-Michigan-Indiana Field. (Actually, Rev. H. Bentrup, who served the deaf from Sept. 1896 to April 1899, first preached in Cleveland—but only a few times. Located in Louisville, Ky., Rev. Bentrup served Cincinnati and Dayton, Ohio, and Indianapolis and Evansville, Ind., often. He also preached in St. Louis, Baltimore, Richmond, Va., Washington, D.C., and Cleveland occasionally).

1911 - Rev Boll received and accepted a call to serve the deaf in New York.

1911 - (May) Rev O.C. Schroeder was installed by Rev. Boll in Detroit, Mich., the new headquarters of the tri-state field.

1918 - Rev. Schroeder accepted a call to the Kansas City, Mo., Field. No pastor could be found for the tri-state field. Rev. Wm. Gielow, headmaster of the Lutheran School for the Deaf in Detroit, served as vacancy pastor. He ministered to the deaf of the Field until early 1920.

1920 - (Jan.) Division of the Field. Rev. William Harms, living in Akron, Ohio, also served Cleveland. In June 1920, however, Rev, Harms resigned. The field was vacant two months.

1920 - (Sept. 4) Rev. E.W. Bohn was installed in Cleveland as the first resident pastor. Pastor Bohn lived in Cleveland until the Summer of 1921. He then moved to Fort Wayne, Ind., where he passed away on Jan. 22, 1922.

1921 - (Fall) Rev. O. C. Schroeder was called and he accepted. Cleveland was now the headquarters of the Ohio Field which extended into New York, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, and Tennessee.

1923 - (Spring) The Lutheran Deafened (the hard of hearing) Club was organized for services, Bible study, and fellowship.

1924 - (May) The deaf were organized as Trinity Lutheran Deaf Congregation. A constitution was adopted. Elected as first officers were: J. Zoeller, President; H. Crittle, Secretary; J. Arndt, Treasurer.

1926 - Trinity Deaf Congregation and the Lutheran Deafened Club showed a genuine interest to secure church property. They looked for a centrally located parish house to serve their needs.

1927 - Combined services for both oral and sign language deaf were conducted for the first time.

1930 - Still looking for a parish house. No indication in the church records to show that property was found.

1930 - (Aug. 31) Rev. N.E. Borchardt was installed as Cleveland's next pastor. It seems that Rev. Schroeder might have stayed in Cleveland and traveled from here to serve Gallaudet College, Washington, D.C.; the state schools in Ky., Tenn., Ga., and Fla.; together with his editing of periodicals for the blind and the deaf-blind. He was living in Chicago by 1931, however.

1937 - (April 11) Rev. Borchardt accepted a call to serve Our Savior Lutheran Church-Deaf in Detroit and was installed there. He later retired as pastor of Lutheran School for the Deaf in Detroit. He passed away on June 20, 1976.

1937 - (July 18) Rev. Theodore Frederking was called and accepted. He was installed in Zion Lutheran Church where the deaf worshiped.

1938 - (March 20) Services for the black deaf began at St. Phillips Lutheran Church.

1943 - (Fall) The congregation was assigned a student (vicar) for a year's practical experience—Mr. Herbert W. Rohe, who later served the deaf as pastor in Pittsburgh, Pa., Field, Rochester, N.Y. Field, and the Texas-Okla. Field. (He later retired as secretary for deaf missions, Board for Missions of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, St. Louis and now live in Nevada, Missouri)

1943 - (Dec. 6) The congregation met to reorganize and rename the church "Christ Lutheran Church for the Deaf."

1944 - (Fall) Another student, Elmer Luessenhop, came for a year's vicarage. He did not become a missionary to the deaf, but served hearing church.

1945 - Christ congregation celebrated the 36th anniversary of regular signed services for area deaf.

1945 - The International Lutheran Women's Missionary League voted to give the congregation \$15,000 for a new chapel.

1946 - (Nov. 26) Congregation was incorporated under Ohio law as "Christ Lutheran Church, East Side."

1948 - (Oct. 10) Groundbreaking service for new chapel.

1948 - (Oct. 19) Cornerstone set.

Phoenix and Tucson, Ariz. on a part-time basis. He passed away on June 12, 1981.

1962 - Vacancy in Cleveland served by Rev. Walter Busby of Rochester, N.Y. Field

preaching stations were served by other pastors of the deaf.

1963 - (July 14) Rev. Martin A. Hewitt, was installed. Rev. N. E. Borchardt was guest speaker.

1963 - (Oct. 6) Ladies' Guild reorganized and voted to join the Lutheran Women's Missionary League. First issue of the *Sower* Newsletter was produced and distributed to keep members and friends informed of activites and worship services.

1965 - (Oct. 24) Chapel was renovated and redecorated. It was rededicated to the glory of God. Rev. H.W. Rohe was guest preacher.

1968 - (Dec 8) The congregation voted to take full responsibility for the whole Cleveland Field.

1969 - (June 22) The congregation celebrated the 20th anniversary of its chapel. Rev. T. Frederking was guest preacher.

1969 - (Sept. 27) The congregation held a special anniversary banquet at Lutheran High School East to commemorate the following anniversaries: 75th of Lutheran Deaf Missions, 60th of regular Lutheran services for the deaf in Cleveland, 45th of its organization as a congregation, 20th of its chapel. Mr. Robert 0. Lankenau of Akron (N.A.D. President and a deaf Lutheran) was guest speaker.

1969 - Christ Lutheran Church Serves 181 Communicant members and 226 baptized members; provides the service of pastor, counselor, interpreter for the Greater Cleveland area; conducts preaching services in Mansfield, Elvria, and Akron; and serves

many other members of the deaf community in Northeastern Ohio. Worship services are conducted simultaneously in both the language of signs and spoken English and are beneficial to oral deaf, signing deaf, and those who depend on both means of communication.

1969 - (June) The Congregation celebrated the 20th anniversary of its chapel. Rev. Frederking was guest preacher.

1970 - (May) Rev. Martin A. Hewitt accepted call to the Holy Cross Lutheran Church in St. Louis. He now lives and serve the deafs in Spokane, Washington.

1970 - (September) Rev. Myron Prok was called and accepted. He was installed Christ Lutheran Church's pastor on November 22nd.

1974 - (Summer) The congregation celebrate the 25th anniversary of the church building. Rev. Frederking was guest speaker.

1975 - Bob Oettel of Illinois accepted Christ's call as Lay Worker.

1978 - Rev. Myron Prok resigned to accept a call to serve a hearing church in Cleveland, Ohio. During the vacancy period, Bob Oettel and Rev. Marcis serve as interpreter and vacancy pastor.

1979 - Rev. Marlow Olson was called and accepted. He was installed as pastor in September.

1980 - Bob Oettel left for Omaha, Nebraska. (He presently is in Japan.)

1982 - Rev. Marlow Olson resigned as pastor. Rev. Zipay of Lorain, Ohio and Shirley Prok served as vacancy pastor and interpreter.

1984 - Rev. Gary L. Lawson was called from Michigan and he accepted to serve as our pastor. He was installed on April 15th.

1998 - Christ congregation and friends celebrate the 50th anniversary of the church building on November 1st. Oritha Lanton and committee did a wonderful job. The nice dinner was donated by AAL Branch #7930.

## WHAT IS ILDA?



The International Lutheran Deaf Association was founded In Chicago during the first biennial convention in 1971. The purpose, according to the revised constitution, is "to coordinate and strengthen the religious activities and services in our congregation to help promote their growth to the highest possible level in service to their Lord and Savior, to promote the Christian faith and life of Lutheran Deaf people, all deaf individuals, and others with whom we associate; and to carry on our ministry throughout the world."

The I.L.D.A. shall communicate and convey to the deaf members, the programs, plans and goals of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. It shall support lay-leadership among deaf Lutherans in all areas of faith and life.

In 1975, the members voted ratification of the revised constitution. The historic document will help develop the I.L.D.A. image and facilitate the operation and administration of the association. The members also supported the goal of recruiting as many lay people as possible and getting them actively Involved In the I.L.D.A. affairs.

In 1987, the aim of I.L.D.A. is to carry out the objectives of serving the Lord in His church and to obtain the financial support that would lead to self-sufficiency. It is hoped that many programs and projects for the ministry and mission of the I.L.D.A. will become a reality.

Membership in the I.L.D.A. is open to all deaf, and is divided into three categories: ACTIVE, ASSOCIATE AND SUSTAINING.

The I.L.D.A. relies on its official publication, THE DEAF LUTHERAN, to convey information of its activities and services to deaf Lutherans.

#### GOD'S 1,000 CLUB

God's 1,000 Club was established by the I.L.D.A. Board of Directors and it aims to continue to grow.

The name "God's 1,000 Clubs" was chosen because, first of all, the work of I.L.D.A. is to get the Good News of God's Son to the deaf everywhere. 1,000 represented the number of donors or club members, we hope to enlist.

People who become members in God's 1,000 Club are asked to **contribute \$10.00 each year** thereafter. This is not a part of the regular I.L.D.A. dues and it does not pay for a subscription to THE DEAF LUTHERAN. Any donations given to God's 1,000 Club, can only be used to help pay the expenses of I.L.D.A. board meetings.
