Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Welcome to the city of Rochester, New York, also known as *The Flower City*, located just south of Greater Lake Ontario and about two hours from the internationally known natural wonder, the Niagara Falls. Because of the natural setting and sheltering from harsh winds and temperatures, the Greater Rochester area has become a prime location for grape growing for wine production. Those who are going on the wine tours will enjoy viewing the vineyards and tasting the New York varieties of wine.

Rochester's population is approximately 210,000, but because of Rochester School for the Deaf and the National Technical Institute for the Deaf, we also have the distinction of having the largest per capita of Deaf people.

We are proud of our upstate New York heritage which began with a purchase of land along the Genesee River by Col. Nathaniel Rochester, Maj. The Erie Canal from here eastward to the Hudson River was opened in 1823. Those who are going on the cruise will enjoy being part of the history that enabled Rochester to become the 2nd largest economic city in New York.

In 1847, Frederick Douglass, a former slave and an antislavery speaker and writer founded the abolitionist newspaper The North Star in Rochester. He is buried in the city's Victorian era Mt. Hope Cemetery. Susan B. Anthony, a well-known women's suffragist is also buried in the same cemetery.

George Eastman became the founder of Eastman Kodak when he rented a 3rd floor in a building to manufacture dry plates for photographic purposes. His business gradually expanded to include Kodak film which became internationally renowned and won several awards in the Academy Awards for the best film used. He also founded the United Way which began as a War Chest to benefit the widows and children after the world wars.

Today, Rochester is the home of Birds Eye vegetables, Ragu pasta sauce, Francesco Rinaldi pasta sauce, Wegman's Grocery stores, Genesee Brewing Company, Zweigle's White Hotdogs, Jell-O and Cool Whip. Other well known companies include Xerox and Bausch & Lomb.

The Host Committee has worked hard to fundraise money and to organize the 20th Biennial ILDA Convention. We wish to welcome you to Rochester, NY and hope you will enjoy your stay here with us as we continue to "Set Our Minds on Things Above" now and in the future. Please enjoy every moment of your stay here in Rochester, New York.

What Is I.L.D.A.?

What is ILDA?

Desiring to be faithful people of God, led by Him and our blessed Saviour, Jesus Christ, and inspired by His Word as it is brought to us in the doctrines, teachings and confessions of The Lutheran Church– Missouri Synod, the International Lutheran Deaf Association commenced its ministry during its first biennial convention in Chicago in 1971.

In aspiring to create the highest possible levels of faith and Christian service in its churches and congregations and to promote the Gospel of Christ among the deaf everywhere, the revised Constitution states the International Lutheran Deaf Association shall "enrich the lives of deaf people through spiritual growth and develop Christian leadership among all with whom we associate."

With over a quarter of a century of faithful service, the International Lutheran Deaf Association offers praise to the Lord of the Church for the many accomplishments it has been permitted to achieve and blessings upon its ministry.

What Has ILDA Done?

With over \$325,000 in mission projects funded since its inception in 1971, both at home and abroad, the ILDA continues its mission of Christian service with a current two year goal of \$27,300 for projects which include continued missionary works in Ghana and India. Thousands of deaf in Ghana are hungry to learn about Jesus. As in the past, help will be sent to Ghana, India, Starfish, and deaf camps. Current projects are as followed: Ghana Luthern Deaf School (\$7,000), Starfish Learning Center (\$4,800), India Outreach Training (\$2,000), Rev. Leber's Deaf Camp in California (\$1,500), Youth Service Project (\$5,000), and Christian/Bible Lessons for Deaf Children (\$7,000).

The International Lutheran Deaf Association in endeavoring to promote spiritual growth, fellowship and Christian service among its membership has also given greater visibility to those outside the hearing church and in so doing has very ably demonstrated their ability to administer their own ministerial programs.

Current and Future Programs

As we near the end of the first one hundred years of enjoying God's Word brought to us in our own language, the International Lutheran Deaf Association confidentially faces the challenges of a new century as a completely self supporting organization in the Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod. Realizing that God opens doors of opportunity where we can be of service to Him, the ILDA will continue its mission of outreach programs wherever such opportunities exist.

Present plans call for continue support for D.I.T. and for the upcoming 3rd Convocation. Future planning also includes giving greater visibility and participation to those who are both deaf and blind and encouraging them to full membership in the ILDA and its programs.

God's 1000 Club

God's 1000 Club

The name "God's 1000 Club" was chosen because, first of all, the work of ILDA is to spread the Good News of God's Son to deaf people everywhere. Second of all, ILDA set up 1000 as the goal of the number of donors or club members we hope to enlist.

All ILDA members are also encouraged to join "God's 1,000 Club" with an additional biannual pledge of twenty dollars (\$20.00) which is earmarked for expenses of the board, thus freeing more of the Association's resources for programs and mission work and achieving self supporting status for the ILDA.
