Constitution and Bylawa 1 of the 2 International Lutheran Deaf Association 3 (ILDA) 4 I. NAME 5 The name of this association is the International Lutheran Deaf Association. 6 II. LOCATION 7 The association shall have as its primary address 500 North Broadway, St. 8 Louis, Mo. 63102, and such other places as the Board of Directors of the ILDA 9 may designate. 10 III. PURPOSE 11 The general and broad purpose of the ILDA shall be to promote the Christian 12 faith and life of Lutheran deaf persons, all deaf persons in fellowship with 13 The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, and all the deaf throughout the world, 14 consistent and in conformity with the Word of God and the Confessions of The 15 Lutheran Church.
