A Human Interest Story for Christmas. . . SHARING CHRISTIAN LOVE THROUGH. . .

About three months ago I had the rare good fortune to get involved with the Big Brother program. Re-involved would be a more apt term. Prior to my disabling illness I was in the program for five years but I was sure that my deafness would prevent my further participation. Donald Kaufman, the local director, contacted me and told me of a deaf little guy they had just accepted for placement and would I be in working with interested kids again.

When I went to pick up Tim for the ball game I first became aware that working with a deaf boy was going to limitless patience, require and also a willingness to triumph measure in little amounts.

Tim, like many pre-lingual deaf (before they have learned to talk), has a pattern to his life that he is afraid to disrupt. Unaware of this, I had arranged to take him to something new and different. This fact, coupled with the idea that I was a comparative stranger, prompted him to refuse to go.

Since that time I've gotten to know Tim better, but still he is unwilling to venture very far from the world he knows and has become accustomed.

Tim is my second experience with the Big Brother program. My first was a beautiful, highly rewarding adventure. Shannon and I enjoyed a remarkable sense of trust and dependence. I had never had a brother, or sister for that matter, so Shan and Crystal, his sister, were truly my Our ties were as family. close or closer than blood.

I joined the Big Brothers in 1967, three years after the local chapter was formed. At the request of William Mathews, the father of a boy killed in a service station robbery, a group of local businessmen were granted a charter for a local unit. The National Organization Was formed in Cincinatti in 1903, with the express purpose of organizing concerned adult males, who wanted to provide a masculine image for fatherless boys. About time I first the started losing my hearing, Shannon's mom got remarried. According to the rules of the Big Brothers, my official status was due to be ended. However, we were good friends and a friendship you can't phase out, so we still are in contact with each other.

After my deafness had progressed to total, I felt sure my involvement with Big Brothers was finished.

I briefly discussed re-involvement with Donald Kaufman, the local Big Brother director. His points were direct, but not very encouraging. He had no deaf applicants and no knowledge of any to come.

Three days later I got a message that the Big Brothers had called and they had a match for me.
