Trinity of Oancover Celebrates 45 Years 1929 Ministring to the Deaf! 1974

VANCOUVER, BRITISH COLUMBIA

On Christmas eve, 1928, Rev. Victor L. Meyer, pastor of Beth-lehem Lutheran Church in Vancouver, met a deaf man, Mr.William Reid, in a restaurant. They spoke about a church for the deaf in Vancover. Mr. Reid took the idea to Mr. and Mrs. Alex Brodie and other deaf friends. On Pastor Meyer's suggestion, Mr. and Mrs. Brodie made a special journey to invite Rev. George W. Gaertner, pastor of Our Redeemer Lutheran Church for the Deaf in Seattle, Washington, to come to Vancover and conduct worship services for the deaf. Pastor Gaertner accept. ed the invitation and held the first service on November 3,1929. Twenty-six deaf people attended that first service at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, and that church remained the home of the deaf church for 33 years.

When Rev.Walter A.Westermann succeeded Rev. Gaertner, he continued the regular monthly services for the deaf in Vancover. On June 16, 1935, Pastor Westermann received the first four deaf adults into membership in the Lutheran Church by confirmation.

In 1942 Rev.Arnold T. Jonas succeeded Rev. Westermann as pastor to the deaf in Seattle and Vancover. Rev. Jonas continued as pastor until 1948.

Rev.John A.Beyer became the new pastor in 1949. Under Pastor Beyer's leadership, the Vancover deaf church group organized in 1957 and chose the name TRINITY

Gehrs 1973 - LUTHERAN CHURCH FOR THE DEAF. Vicar Martin A. Hewitt was appointed to assist Pastor Beyer in 1961. Vicar Hewitt lived and worked in Vancover, so weekly services were conducted with mon thly services in Victoria, Surrey and Richmond. As the congrega-

tion grew it was decided to call a full-time ordained pastor.

In 1962, Rev. Wayne C. Bottlinger accepted the call as resident Pastor. The services were moved to Killarney Park Lutheran Church. Mr. Alex M. Brodie was commissioned as lay worker assistant to Pastor Bottlinger in 1966. Trinity congregation built the present church building and Trinity Lutheran Church for the Deaf 2960 School Avenue Dedicated: September 10, 1967

it was dedicated to the Glory of God on September 10, 1967.

Rev. Frederick P. Gehrs accepted the call to succeed Rev. Bottlinger and was installed as the new pastor on November 4, 1967.

A BIOGRAPHY OF THE REV. DR. HUGO A. GAMBER, LittD.

The Reverend Hugo A. Gamber was born on December 1, 1892, in Davenport, Iowa. He was baptized and confirmed in Trinity Lutheran Church in Davenport by Pastor A.D. Greif. He was graduated with honor from Concordia College, Milwaukee, in 1913, and from Concordia Seminary, St.Louis, in 1916.

His first call was to Finlayson, Minn esota, where he was ordained and installed on August 27, 1916. He served there five years. In November, 1921, he accepted a call to Trinity, Carver, Minnesota, where he served until November, 1926. Pastor Gamber then served at Bethlehem congregation, St. Paul, for 26 years, In January, 1953, he became pastor of Christ congregation, St.Paul, and served there until he retired in September, 1958. From 1961 until 1971, Pastor Gamber served as Visitation Pastor at South Shore Trinity Church of White Bear Lake.

In addition to his duties in the parish ministry, Pastor Gamber was privileged to serve in various other capacies. He was a member of Synod's Board of Missions for the Deaf and Blind from 1927 to 1947, during seventeen of which he served as chairman; a member of the Finance Committee of the Minnesota District from 1930 to 1936; Chaplain of St. John's Lutheran Hospital in St.Paul from 1936 to 1949; pastoral advisor of the North-Central District of the Lutheran Laymen's Leaque from 1945 to 1958; and President

A memorial service was held for Rev. Gamber in SouthShore Trinity Lutheran Church,White Bear Lake, Minnesota December 28, 1974. Rev.Herbert Rohe attended and spoke to the mourners on behalf of the Board for Missions and our Ministry to the Deaf.

As I review the bulletins which came into the office in December and January, I am deeply impressed by the listing of church officers newly elected for 1975. Some bulletins also list the officers of the LWML, Ladies Guilds, ILDA, Regions and other organizations. One congregation elected twenty new officers.

Sum totally, in our fifty plus deaf congregations, there are at least five hundred persons elected to office. What a marvelous working force! Think of it! Five hundred hours for the Lord. Many officers contribute freely much more than an hour's time, more often it is ten times and more. During a recent vacancy, one president counted thirtysix hours per week he devoted to his church! Think of it again! Five thousand hours for the Lord. More accurately ten thousand hours, or even twenty thousand. At \$2.00 an hour, this would come to \$40,000 donated labor and time.
