Surprised by Joy!

Have you ever been happily surprised? So completely surprised that it leaves you stunned? So utterly happy that you can hardly believe it? That's what EASTER IS ALL ABOUT! Just read St. Mark's record of the resurrection, for he says, "AND THEY WERE AMAZED" (Mark 16:5). They were so overcome with happiness that nothing else mattered. They could drop everything else and RUN to spread the good news. Perhaps we are not "surprised by joy" this Easter because we have heard all about this many, many times before. But just let the Spirit of God warn your heart right now and you can catch that same "amazing joy."

OUR JOY, THAT HATH NO END.

Now after the sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the sepulchre. And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone, and sat upon it. His appearance was like lightening, and his rainment white as snow. And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for He has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where He lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples that He has risen from the dead, and behold He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see Him. Lo, I have told you." So they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell His disciples.

It was C.S. Lewis, the noted Oxford scholar and defender of the faith who wrote the story of his life and used as the title of his autobiography "SURPRISED BY JOY". In his early life when he was a soldier and a scientist, he has become an atheist. But later in his life, when he was convinced of the truth of Christianity, he wrote some of the most brilliant books in defense of God's love in Christ. Early in his life he considered religion as something dull and boring. Who would want such a monotonous life? But when he permitted the Holy Spirit to really open his eyes, he was AMAZED HOW MUCH JOY THERE COULD BE IN BELIEVING. His writings most graphically describe what Christianity can mean to a person. No one can know who has never tried it. Isn't that why the experience of the women, early at the tomb on the first Easter, is so typical? They were amazed at what they found. So was everyone else who heard of the risen Christ on that first Easter Day. Someone has said: "If you are looking for arguments to prove that Jesus really (please turn to page 7)

HEW Renews Support for Study of Communication Skills of Deaf Children

BOWLING GREEN, OHIO -- A Bowling Green State University psychologist has received a \$54,814 grant from the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare (HEW) to continue his study of communication skills of deaf and hearing children.

The study conducted by Dr. Harry W. Hoemann, associate professor of psychology, has received more than \$200,000 in funding since 1970 and is one of the longest on-going research projects at the University.

During the past seven years Dr. Hoemann has evaluated and compared the development of communication skills in deaf children and those who can hear. Although many deaf children have normal intelligence, deaf youngsters are often two to four years behind normal children in the acquisition of formal communication skills, Dr. Hoemann has learned.

The psychologist said the

ings to other children who will then try to select the pictures described from among a number of drawings. The success of the communication will be measured by counting the number of times youngsters can select the appropriate pictures.

"If I can demonstrate success with a communication training program, perhaps eventually such training will be included in standard curricula," Dr. Hoemann said.

A faculty member at Bowling Green since 1969, Dr. Hoemann is author of "The American Sign Language" published by the National Association of the Deaf. Also, along with his wife Shirley, he designed a deck of flash cards to use in teaching sign language vocabulary to the deaf.

WASHINGTON, - The Federal Government has decided to make it a bit more complicated and possibly more expensive for persons to buy hearing aids.

But the Food and Drug Administration says the added complexity is necessary to protect persons from being sold hearing aids when what they really need is medical or surgical treatment to correct a hearing loss.

go a medical evaluation of their hearing loss by a doctor, preferably an ear specialist. Such an examination costs between \$15 and \$30, depending on the city.

"Hearing loss can result from a number of conditions and diseases for which a hearing aid may not be helpful," said Sherwin Gardner, acting FDA commissioner. "This regulation is designed to protect consumers from being sold hearing aids that won't help them and to assure that people see a doctor if there is a medical reason for their hearing loss.

Such medical reasons include infections, tumors, the so-called collagen diseases, and mechanical impairment of the sound-transmitting bones in the middle ear.

The regulation, however, contains what Consumers Union has called a "massive loophole." It permits adult customers to sign a paper waiving the medical examination. "Hearing-aid dealers in pursuit of a fast sale will be tempted to push the waiver, not the examination," the group commented, although the regulation forbids dealers from encouraging the waiver.

next stage of his research will be to attempt to train deaf children to communicate more successfully in formal communication situations.

"Schools for the deaf spend a great deal of time teaching language but there is no particular training in communication," Dr. Hoemann explained, adding that the youngsters often have few opportunities to gain experience in formal communication.

Dr. Hoemann plans to develop a communication training program for youngsters by working with teachers and children in schools for the deaf. In experimental program exercises, deaf

The new procedure will be scmewhat like buying drugs with a doctor's prescription, except that a person may still insist on buying a new hearing aid with -out seeking a doctor. Prescription drugs cannot legally be bought unless a physician approves.

New FDA regulations, announced on February 13, 1977 but not effective until August 15th, require hearing aid dealers to recommend to all prospective customers that they first under-

All of a sudden little Jennifer ran into the kitchen crying. Her mother asked, "what was the matter, Jenny?" In between sobs, Jennifer said, "I was putting the jig-saw puzzle together, and I lost a piece of the puzzle. Mommy, a piece is missing!" Then Jennifer started crying again.

This is a little story, but from this story we get an idea of what many congregations find themselves talking about in church quite often.

Paul says in his first letter to the Corinthians that all of us Christians are part of a puzzle, or as Paul says, "parts of one body." That body is the church, the fellowship of believers. At the head of this body is Jesus Christ himself. All of us are the arms, legs, feet and hands and all the other parts of that body. Paul also says that one part of the body can't work alone. The parts of the body need each other to strengthen and support each other. The same is true of us Christians. We need each other, we need to receive the encouragement of our brothers and sisters in the faith. A convenient place to do this work for Christ together is in your church. Truly, this is one of the main reasons for having a church, a fellowship of believers...strengthening and helping one another in the faith. When one part of the body doesn't do it's work the whole body and fellowship of believers hurts.

It is interesting to realize the number of countries that have associated the egg with Easter season and to consider the traditions the different nations have regarding it. In Germany, for example, the Easter hare is supposed to bring the eggs, but only if the children have been good, truthful, and kind. Then and only then will the hare steal into their homes on Easter Eve and hide colored eggs while the youngsters slept. This myth is the only one behind the Easter Bunny in this country, When the hare idea reached our country, and it was discovered how rare the hare was, his close relative, the rabbit, was adopted. carrier of Easter eggs, became part of American Mythology.

Originally the hare was accepted by the Egyptians. In their legends, he was the symbol of the moon. The date of Easter is determined by the moon. In A.D. 325 it was decided that Easter should fall on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox, which is the 21st of March.

In the 18th century egg races were the main event of the Easter fete in many parts of France, and these races and other egg games are still popular there.

In the Northern Shires of England eggs are saved throughout Holy Week. Then on Easter Day the annual egg rolling takes place, This isn't much different from the White House egg rolling enjoyed each year by our American smallsters.

The children of Bohemia roll their colored eggs on tracks made of sticks, and in Ireland the eggs are eaten at dawn to break their lenten fast. Scotch boys and girls play a kind of ball game with their eggs, and in Austrian Tyrol the children carry baskets and torches on the night before Easter and go from farmhouse to farmhouse. At each place they are given brightly colored eggs, which they put in their baskets. The women who dye the eggs vie with one another to see who can make the most elaborate decorations: some even laboricusly print names and mottos on the dyed shells.

rose from the dead, here is one of the best. NOBODY EXPECTED IT, AND YET IT HAPPENED!"

Remember Harry Houdini, the great magician? Before he died he told his wife that he would return from the spirit world to tell her what it was like. She didn't believe it; yet just on the chance that it might be true - she kept a rendezvous (meeting) at the appointed spot for ten years on the anniversary of his death. The disciples of Jesus Christ didn't have that much faith. Not one of them bothered to check the grave on the third day, even though Jesus had said it again and again that He would rise. And when the women went out to the tomb to complete their final rites of respect and affection(love) on Easter morning, they did not see Him rise. There wasn't even a trace of "wishful thinking" among His followers. In fact, His enemies remembered what He had said and

"set a watch" (Matt. 27:66).But the followers were AMAZED. It took a shocking experience to change them from doubters into believers. The resurrection had an unexpected ending forChrist's followers as well as for His enemies.

Do you expect too little from your faith? Then you may get only little. The disciples on the first Easter got more than they expected. You and I can get more from an "Easter life: if we let God surprise us with a deeper understanding of what it all means.

We consider as wise the person who can learn from the mistakes of others. Real students of history can learn from the pitfalls which caused many a nation to crumble and fall. Bible students can also learn much from the importance the women placed on the anointing of Christ's body after Good Friday. Have you ever wondered what happened to all the spices and ointments which the women purchased and prepared for that day? They probably dropped everything in their amazement. These things were useless to them now. In a sense, we can look back and say this was a sad lesson on an otherwise happy day Would it have been sad if Christ had been more REAL to them? Oh, they accepted Him as a wonderful Jewish Rabbi, a most thoughtful and loving person; but THEY DID NOT SEE IN HIM GOD'S FULFILLMENT OF LCVE. They did not comprehend(understand) that this love brought Him to the cross and into the tomb as the Savior of mankind. To them He was not the REAL Christ who had explained so often that this was all necessary and that He would prove the power of His love and the Father's acceptance of His sacrifice by the glory of an Easter Dawn. Just picture what it might have been, had they rushed out to the garden early that dawn to EXPECT that victorious Christ!

How "real" is this Christ to us? Just what do we expect from Him for life -- now and eternally? Do we waste money and effort just like the women did? Again, because they had the wrong picture of Christ, they worried and were afraid on that first Easter, saying "Who will roll away the stone for us from the door of the tomb?" As they looked back, didn't this seem foolish? Can't this also strike very close to us? If we could see our worries and our fears! It's so easy to worry about our health, our hearing, our vision, cur lonesomeness, our security. If Christ is REAL to us, and in the light of an EASTER DAWN, is not this foolish?

make EVERY DAY an Easter. Every sunrise brings the newness of His love.

St. Mark tells us that the women's first reaction to the amazement was coupled with fear, so they told no one at first. But that was only because they did not have the complete story. They had not yet personally seen the risen Christ. They were only told that He had risen. KNOWING the living Christ, SEE-ING HIM with the eyes of faith is what it takes to know the real JOY OF EASTER. Surprises can be great, but fulfilled expectations are even greater. Can't you just picture thethrill of these women had they been anticipating the resurrection had they really listened to the promises of Jesus that this would happen? Their Easter joy would have been so much greater. Aren't you more blessed than these women? It's a matter of record that Christ rose from the grave, that His heavenly Father accepted His sacrifice, and that we too shall follow His resurrection with a glorified body. And do you realize that you cannot even BEGIN TO IMAGINE all the good things that the Lord has in mind for you when you accept Him as your Savior and your King!

Walk in the "Easter glow; already NOW, BECAUSE IT'S YOURS! Already NOW you are a child of God, receiving all the concern and love which our great God can give. With this attitude, can anything really "get you down"? Say with St. Paul, "All things work together for good to them that love God." (Rom. 8:28). "I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Rom. 8:38-39. "For me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." (Phil. 1:21). So anticipate with joy forgiveness and fortitude, confidence and calmness, His loving presence and guiding ways. Then both God and man will know that you have seen the real Easter.
