LaVerne Merlyn Mass was born December 27, 1934. He received Holy Baptism January 30, 1935, in St. Paul's Lutheran Church, New Ulm, Minnesota.

LaVerne matured in the true faith through Jesus Christ and completed his confirmation training with Pastor W.A. Krueger in Grace Lutheran Church, Correll, Minnesota, on June 27, 1948.

He attended elementary school at Correll Public School and his secondary schooling at Minnesota School for the Deaf

THE REV. RICHARD A. MOODY

Pastor Moody is the son of Perry and Mimi Lou Moody of Crawford, Nebraska, where he was born on February 27, 1952.

He began his pre-seminary studies at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln in 1970. In Dec. 1975 he graduated from the College of Engineering with a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering.

In June of that same year, prior to graduation from Nebraska, he enrolled at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, Missouri. "I can remember when I was beginning high school, I thought about becoming a pastor, " Moody smiled in reflection.

"I started studying sign language as an extra course. Then I helped interpret lectures at the Seminary. I learned most of my signs there. I had no idea there was such a large and growing field for work with the deaf as there is in the Lutheran Church/Missouri Synod."

Pastor Moody completed his field work at Holy Cross and served his vicarage at Gallaudet College for the Deaf in Washington, D.C. While there he worked with Rev. Daniel Pokorny where he perfected his sign language.

In 1977 Pastor Moody married a nurse, Lois a native of Webster Groves. The two are the proud parents of a daughter, Jennifer Christine, born July 15th of this year.

He began helping out at Holy Cross last September under Rev. James R. Taglauer, interim pastor at Holy Cross until his installation on June 17, 1979.

in Faribault, Minnesota, which was necessitated due to a mastoid operation which in 1942 left him completely deaf. However he mastered the art of lip reading easily.

Following his graduation from high school (M.S.D.) in May, 1952, he eventually became a journeyman printer. He was a graphic arts instructor at Arizona School for the Deaf from 1961 until 1962. Besides being highly proficient as a Linotype operator, he was also known as a "Jack-of-all Trades" and owned an impressive number of tools that enabled him to tackle any job. (What a good thing for his next church congregation to know).

LaVerne Mass and Joan Olenda Fonder were united in Holy Matrimony, January 31, 1954, by Pastor R.F. Cordes in Trinity Lutheran Church, Ortonville, Minnesota. From this blessed union three sons and a daughter were born.

LaVerne had always felt that God's purpose for him on earth was to become a minister of His Word to the deaf. With the assistance of Pastor R.L. Thompson and several letters, LaVerne was accepted into Concordia Theological Seminary (Evangelical Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod) Fort Wayne, Ind. as a non-degree student in their colloquy program. That was in 1976. On April 2, 1979, LaVern completed all the required academic studies. He took his vicarage training with St. John's Lutheran Church for the Deaf in Fort Wayne, Indiana.

On July 13, 1979, LaVerne received and accepted the divine call to become Pastor to Pilgrim Deaf Lutheran Church in Kansas City, Missouri.

August 26, 1979, LaVerne Mass was ordained a Minister of the Word of Jesus Christ in The Lutheran Church/Missouri Synod. The ordination took place at The Word of God Lutheran Church for the Deaf in Cedar Rapids, Iowa.

The Wheat Ridge Foundation grew out of a Lutheran TB Sanatorium established in Wheat Ridge, Colorado, in 1905. Wheat Ridge was one of the first charitable organizations in the U.S. to issue Christmas Seals -- with the first Wheat Ridge Seals appearing in 1910.

The Wheat Ridge Seals gift effort continues to be an annual Christmas tradition in some 5200 Lutheran Congregations in the U.S. and Canada-generally conducted as a service project of the congregational youth group.
