"All you need is faith to be saved. The church doesn't save me." Many good and respected people think that way. Some people go to church once or twice a year. Some Christians doesn't go at all. Does Jesus want HIs followers to stay away from church? What does Jesus say about not going to church? WE ARE HAPPY TO HEAR THAT YOU BELIEVE IN

LORDY SMITH, MEMPHIS, WINS "DEAF WOMAN OF THE YEAR" AWARD

The District 23 (Tenn., Ark., Miss.) Quota Clubs recently chose Ms. Lordy Smith of Memphis, Tenn. as the "Deaf Woman of the Year." This award is based upon the individual's success in her career, having shared with the community in service to others, and demonstrating excellent leadership qualities. All of these attributes certainly describe Lordy Smith.

An employee of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, Ms. Smith is presidentelect of the board of directors of the Interpreting Service for the Deaf; president of the Memphis Chapter of the Black Deaf Advocates; a member of the Memphis subchapter of the Tennessee Assocation of the Deaf and an active leader at the Eternal Mercy Lutheran church. Ms. Smith, a widow, finds time to raise four sons. Lordy is also secretary of the Dixie Deaf Lutheran conference. JESUS. BUT, THEN, WE DON'T UNDERSTAND WHY YOU DON'T GO TO CHURCH. IF YOU ARE ONE OF THESE PEOPLE, THEN THIS STORY IS FOR YOU.

First, you say that you are a Christian by faith in Jesus. Then it is right that other people follow your example and do what you do. Now suppose that all people did not go to any church. What would happen? In a short time, all churches would close; no congregation would build a church if they are going to be empty. Now do you feel right about your example that says there is no need to go to church? Do you want to help the churches close?

Secondly, you might say you read the Bible and watch the sermons on TV. If everyone did this, soon there would be no more gospel sermons on the networks. Why not? Because preachers need to be trained in the colleges and seminaries, which are built and supported by Christians who go to church, who in turn, put their finances together to help such schools and do mission work, obeying Jesus' command to "Preach the Gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). This cannot be done if you stay home. In the Lord's Prayer, we chant 'Thy Kingdom Come' which means "let your church grow and prosper." Now can you honestly say to God, "O yes, Lord, I want Your Kingdom to come, but do not depend on me to do Your work?" By staying away from church, that is what you are telling God by your actions.

Thirdly, there is another important thing lost when we fail to attend church. We lose the sacraments of Baptism and the Lord's Supper. Concerning these, Jesus gave a clear command, "Repent and be baptized for the forgiveness of your sins" (Acts 2:38). For the Lord's Supper (also called Holy Communion and the Eucharist) Jesus Himself says, "This do in remembrance of Me." (I Cor. 11:24, 25) Can we really call ourselves Christians if

we fail to go to church month after month and year after year? Accepting Christ means obeying Him as Lord and Master all our lives.

Is reading your Bible and watching sermons on TV really enough? We need the support and fellowship of like minded fellow believers to comfort and support us, and who like ourselves, are awaiting the coming again of the Lord. We cannot fight the temptations and wiles of Satan all alone.

Fourth, the Bible says that the Word of God "is able to save your soul (James 1:21) How? Because of the preaching of the Gospel, the Holy Spirit moves you to believe that Jesus Christ is your Saviour. In Romans, we read that "Faith comes by hearing . . . the Word of God." The Bible also tells us that a secret faith is not the right kind of faith. We are to confess our faith in front of other people. This we do in church. We cannot do that alone.

Lastly, our Lord says in Luke 10:16, "He that hears you, hears Me." If you knew that Jesus was going to preach in a certain church, you would go and hear Him, wouldn't you? We think you would. In the verse above, Jesus is saying that He is still preaching here on earth through His followers. Those who reject Jesus' followers, reject Him also. If we reject the church, and if we reject those who share God's Word, then we reject the Lord as well. Is this what you want?

Make plans to come to church this Sunday. Ask yourself this question: "is it good for me to stay home and have more sleep or go out and have fun and not go to church, because when I do that, I am telling Jesus I am rejecting Him? And, Who is my God, my pleasure or God, the Father of my Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, who is also God?"

May God help you answer that question.
