# 1993 Convention Issue . . **VELCOME TO AUSTIN**

As this issue goes to press, only about 12 weeks remain before we will all gather in Austin, Texas for our 12th biennial convention, the first ever to be held in the deep south.



Four years in the planning, the 1993 convention promises to have a little bit everything of for everybody. A new addition for this convention will be choir competition, along

with the usual contests for banners and skits. The choir contest will be limited to two categories of no more than six choirs each with each group with a deaf or hearing director. Taped music will be permitted, but each choir must provide their own equipment and the music must have a Christian message. With a June 1 deadline for entries there is a need to hurry if your choir wishes to compete.

### 1000 CLUB LUNCHEON

Taking their cue from the last ILDA convention at Toledo, which saw a very well attended dinner for 1000 club members, a repeat luncheon for this select group will be held at noon on Saturday, July 3. A fine menu has been planned for only \$9.00 and if you wish to attend, be sure you have reservation in by June 15. Remember, you must be a member of God's 1000 Club to attend. Membership is obtained by an annual pledge of 10 dollars to the ILDA, which is in addition to the usual membership fee. Money so pledged is set aside for board expenses, thus freeing more funds for important mission projects.

# CONVENTION TOURS

This year there will be no fewer than three well planned tours to choose from giving visitors an opportunity to see a lot of the Texas heartland. All three tours occur on Friday, July 2 and last approximately eight hours, except the Austin trip, which is six hours. Tour prices include, in addition to the bus ride, costs for interpreters and meals.

Among the choices to be offered are one to San Antonio and the famous Alamo, old Spanish missions and Riverwalk and El Mercado, the Spanish market and many colorful stores.

Another choice would be to the LBJ Ranch which was the home of the 36th President of the United States, Lyndon B. Johnson. Besides seeing the boyhood home of LBJ and some of the Texas Hill country and the magnificent working ranch, you are promised a Texas BBQ dinner and all the trimmings. Sound good? Then this would be for you.

Want to stay in town and see the capitol city? The LBJ presidential library? The governor's mansion?

Austin is also the home of the Texas School for the Deaf, and although there is no mention made of a stop at the school, one could probably be made if enough persons were interested.

All tour registrations have a deadline of June 22 and no refunds will be made except if the bus company is forced to cancel the tour(s). See the flyer in this issue for further information.

to some individual, who in the judgement of the committee, "have willingly served their Lord through voluntary service for other individuals through their congregation and region."

Given in memory of Uriel C. Jones, an educator at the Tennessee School for the Deaf, who gave unselfishly of himself in the service of others, both through his school and church and the ILDA. Mr. Jones was also a former editor of THE DEAF LUTHERAN. Eight awards have been made since the first one was presented in 1977 with two of those recipients since having departed.

Nominations for this year's award should be in the hands of the committee by June 15.

### JUNIOR ILDA

Realizing that the future of the ILDA and of all organizations, for that matter, is in the hand of our young people, the Junior ILDA will meet for its third biennial convention the same time as its national counterpart. In addition to the usual events in conjunction with the Junior ILDA, a trip to FIESTA TEXAS, an amusement park in San Antonio is planned. Youngsters are encouraged to bring an extra \$25.00 for lunch, supper, snacks and drinks while at the park. T-shirts and other souvenirs will be extras if desired.

#### BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The Board of Directors will be meeting for two days prior to the opening date of the convention from June 29 through noon on Thursday, July 1 at the Best Western Chariot Motel which is located a block away from convention headquarters, the Red Lion Hotel--Austin Airport. All regional presidents make up the Board of Directors as well as those elected by the convention to the Executive Committee and will be expected to be in attendance. Others will attend as called by the president.

#### EPHPHATHA CONFERENCE

This year's Ephphatha Conference will be held at Concordia College, Austin, on the dates of June 26 beginning with supper at 5 p.m. and conclude at 1 p.m. on Thursday, July 1. The Ephphatha Conference is the annual meeting of pastors serving the deaf in the Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod. Participants can continue their stay at the college during the ILDA convention, but there will be no meals available. A campground is nearby.

### BABYSITTING SERVICES

Families traveling with small children and wondering what they will do with the kids during the convention need not worry. For only 75¢ per hour per child or \$25.50 for the entire week-end, you can put your cares to rest, knowing the kids will be receiving excellent care and kept busy while mom and dad enjoy the convention. Lutheran Youth groups under adult supervision will provide the babysitting services. The only thing extra would be a fund for your child's meals, snacks and crafts.

If you are going to need this service, mark off your registration form. Among the activities provided will be video, toys, trips to park or other outings.

### SPECIAL CONVENTION FARES

Special fares for ILDA members traveling to Austin for the convention are available. Those departing fron an airport city served by either America West Airlines or Continental Airlines should contact Travel Professionals International at 1-800-695-6953 (V) or 1-800-945-4410 (TT) or 1-505-624-9406 (V) or 1-503-646-2103 (TT). Special fares will provide the traveler with a 5% discount off the lowest published fare that they qualify for.

If you are planning a pre-convention or post convention trip in connection with your travel to Austin, you should advise Travel Professionals of this fact for possible additional savings.

In addition to all the excitement of biennial convention, there is the importance of the business meetings and election of officers, who will guide the association through the interim between conventions. Some very important planning will occur over the next two years as we prepare for our centennial obervance of deaf ministry in the Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod and our 25th anniversary as an organization, which will take place in Chicago in 1995.

section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code has been approved. Also indicated is that the ILDA is not a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509 (a) and further that the ILDA is not subject to excise taxes under chapter 42 of the code.

Having cleared this hurdle, the way is open for the Association to apply to The Lutheran Church--Missouri Synod for Auxiliary Status. Approval for this will have to come from the delegates at the Synod's 1995 convention in St. Louis. cuss deaf ministry in their respective denominations.

At the conclusion of the three-day meeting it was agreed that another convocation would be held within 10 years to "see where we have been, where we are now and where we are going" in the future.

With this in mind, the Board of Directors of the International Lutheran Deaf Association has decided to host the next convocation to be held sometime well after the celebration in Chicago in 1995 and before the year 2000.

Having enjoyed God's Word brought to us in our own language since 1894 when the first service for aeaf Lutherans was held in Chicago, the Lord of the Church has truly blessed the work of bringing salvation to His children who share the handicap of deafness.

A committee to begin work on this project has been named. They will be Rev. Donald W. Zuhn of Houston, Texas; Rev. Richard A. Moody of St. Louis; Mr. Ronald L. Madding of Portland, Ore., and Lester Ahls, Cedar Falls, Iowa, who will chair the committee.

A preliminary meeting will be held during the ILDA convention in Austin this summer at which possible sites for the Convocation will be studied; fund raising needs evaluated; topics to be covered and speakers chosen.

Inasmuch as this is a long term project, additional details will be announced as they become available.

# International Lutheran Deaf Association

Deaf Lutheran congregations are invited to participate in the Banner, Skit and Choir competitions at the 1993 ILDA Convention in Austin, Texas.

All entries must have a Christian message. Banner and skits entries may have a message based on the convention theme, *"Jesus is the Lone Star"*. The deadline for registering for the competitions is June 1, 1993.

# **Banner Competition**

Banners must have the following dimensions: Width between 32 and 40 inches Length between 48 and 60 inches

The ILDA has have 8-foot poles and floor stands to display your banner. If you are unable to bring your own horizontal rod to hang your banner, the convention banner committee can provide a 1/2 inch rod. Each banner must have the name and address of the congregation on the back.

# Skit Competition

Skits should be based on the convention theme, and limited to 10 minutes in length. There is no limit on the number of actors/actresses in a skit. Entrants must provide their own costumes, props, etc. Competition will be limited to the first ten congregations registering for the Skit Competition. All congregations sending entries will be informed if they have been accepted or not.

# Choir Competition

### This competition will be divided into two categories:

a. Choirs with deaf directors (leaders)

b. Choirs with hearing directors (leaders)

Choirs may sing one or two songs with a combined length of not more than five minutes. Song must have a Christian message. Songs may be accompanied by taped music; if so, choirs must provide their own equipment. Competition will be limited to the first six choirs registered for each category. All congregations sending entries will be informed if they have been accepted or not.
