## DEAF LUTHERAN DEVOTION

*Rev.* 14:12 "This calls for patient endurance on the part of the saints who obey God's commandments and remain faithful to Jesus."

November 1st is called All Saints Day in our church. This is the day that we remember all of our loved ones who died as believers in Christ. Now when we think of that word "saint" we think about a very holy person, someone that was outstanding, like Mother Theresa. Or perhaps you think of someone who has had a great influence on many people, like St. Paul or one of the other apostles or disciples of Jesus. Or perhaps your idea of a saint is one of God's heroes who had a close relationship with God, like Moses, Abraham, or David. But did you ever think of yourself as a "saint"? The true Biblical meaning of the word "saint" is not someone who has struggled to achieve a high level of Christlikeness, but one who is a Christian - nothing more than this, but also nothing less. The necessary requirement for you to become a "saint" is faith and trust in Christ as the Lord and Savior of your life.

Faith and trust in Christ requires that you walk following HIS footsteps and continue on a path of growth in your spiritual life. Your "saintly" life began the day of your baptism as God, because of Jesus' death on the cross, washed away all your sins and made you one of HIS own precious children. But children don't remain children all their life, they learn every day from their parents and the people around them. They learn that obedience gains rewards. As God's children grow in their faith, their obedience to God's commands brings them into a very special and close relationship with their heavenly Father, and they reap the rewards that that obedience brings (peace, joy, love, contentment, & happiness).

Finally, when we use the word "saint" we do not mean a perfectly holy person. All those we call "saints", living or dead, were still humans and therefore still sinful. As Martin Luther wrote, we are both sinner and saint at the same time. Do I fully understand that idea? No, I confess that I do not fully understand it. Do I believe that it is true? Yes, I do believe that it is true, because the Bible tells me that in so many places. "Be faithful, even to the point of death, and I will give you the crown of life." John tells us in Revelation 2:10.



## Lutheran Deaf Camp of California 1997...

From Sunday afternoon July 27 to Friday afternoon August 1, fortyseven deaf and hearing children enjoyed the outdoors at El Camino Pines Camp about 60 miles north of Los Angeles. The week included Bible Study, Crafts, Singing, Archery, Swimming, Hiking, Sleeping under the stars, Rock climbing (for the brave at heart), and evening campfires. The children made a wooden cross during the week to take home and hang in their bedrooms. Camp El Camino Pines provides one college age trained counselor for each cabin. The following four digits with a period indicate the last date your subscription has beem paid to. For example, **12.97** mean you have paid for issues up to December of the year 1997.
