DEAF LUTHERAN DEVOTION

Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, the only true Savior of sinners. Already, just as we completed the Advent Season, the **Lent Season** is almost already here! Now, it is time for us to quickly shift our attention from the Babe who was born for sinners to the Son of man, who is also the Son of God that was to be crucified for sinners.

Most of us know a little bit about the importance and significance of observing Lent before Easter arrives. But I think it is a good time for us to quickly review the Lent season in order to more appreciate what the Lord God has done for us sinners. Most active Christians set aside the 40 days, not counting Sundays, as a personal time of reflection (looking back on our sinful life and thinking upon the great mercy of the Lord) and devotion (paying homage/respect to HIM by reading HIS Word).

Jewish tradition had encouraged a time of preparation for important religious celebrations/observances. Since the first early Christians were mostly Jewish, it was only natural that they set up a special time for personal reflection and devotion before the celebration of the glorious bodily resurrection of the King Jesus Christ, the Savior of the sinners. Such a celebration is known as "Pasch" or Easter, the most important major Christian festival of the Church year.

The main reason why the early Christians chose the 40 days as the time frame of personal reflection and devotion is the number of times in the Bible of the usage of 40 days. For example, Moses spent 40 days in fasting on Mt. Sinai before receiving the Ten Commandments (*Exodus* 34:28). Elijah fasted for 40 days on his way to Horeb (I *Kings* 19:8). Jesus fasted for 40 days in the desert before HIS temptation by Satan (*Matthew* 4:2).

According to church history, the length of the time for Lent had been changed several times over years. In the early church times, it was a 36-day period of fast. During the rule of Charlemagne (Charles the Great, the emperor of the Holy Roman Empire) in the year of 800 AD, the church added four days to Lent to make it 40 days, the same of which is in agreement with the above passages of Moses, Elijah and Jesus.

Ash Wednesday is the first day that begins Lent. It is the time when active Christians show their humility before the throne of the Almighty God. Some churches use ashes (burned palm leaves from the year before) to be put on the foreheads of repentant sinners as a reminder that they are to be returned to dust (*Genesis* 3:19).

Maundy Thursday is the day of commemoration (celebration of memory of someone or something) of the time when Jesus sat with HIS disciples as HE instituted (began) the Lord's Supper (also known as the Holy Communion). The Word "Maundy" comes from Latin, which means "commandment." On that night Jesus gave a new commandment to HIS disciples to love each other just as Jesus loved them (John 13:34).

Good Friday is the commemoration of the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. It seems a little strange to call this unique day "Good" Friday, but it is not. The reason why it is called "Good" Friday is that when Jesus said, "It is finished," HE completed the plan of salvation for sinners. That is, HE lived in perfect obedience unto HIS death, a sacrificial offering for every sin that has been accepted by God. So what was meant to be evil came out as good.

Easter, of course, is the culmination (highest point, climax, end) of Lent when all Christians, both active and inactive, come together on Sunday to celebrate the victorious resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ.

May the Lord of mercy and love always keep you in the true faith in Christ, the Author and Perfecter of faith. (*Hebrews* 12:2)

Holy Three-in-One Houston Celebrates 40 years of Ministry

On October 22, 2000, Holy Three-in-One Lutheran Church for the Deaf celebrated its 40th anniversary of organization with a service of thanksgiving. Sixty-five members and visitors joined together for a worship service followed by a luncheon. The Reverend Robert Case and his wife, Mary, traveled from Omaha, Nebraska to renew old friendships and celebrate 40 years of blessing. Reverend Case served as the first full time Pastor at Holy Three-in-One and agreed to deliver the sermon at the 40th anniversary service.

The History of Three-in-One began when on January 11, 1960, the Board of elders of Trinity Lutheran Church (hearing) in downtown Houston authorized Rev. Ervin Oermann to conduct services for the deaf in the church balcony during the regular church services for the hearing. Services continued to be held there until a house at 4411 LaBranch was donated to the Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod by Mr. and Mrs. Alvin A. Klein who were members for Trinity Lutheran Church at the time. The LCMS through it's Texas District made the house available to Three-in-One to use as a church. Three-in-One had three pastors serve part

Johnny Bergstresser has Received his New Kidney

On Sunday morning, New Year Eve (December 31, 2000), Johnny Bergstresser, son of Rev. Edwin and Nancy Bergstresser of Holy Cross Deaf, Columbus, Ohio, has received his long-waited needed kidney. He has received a kidney that matched his blood type from an unknown man. A surprised time while at Trinity Lutheran Church and at the LaBranch location. Pastors Ervin Oermann, Herbert Rohe, and Donald Haug also served other deaf congregations in the state of Texas under a multiple-parish arrangement.

In 1978, Three-in-One called Rev. Robert Case to be their first full-time pastor. After Rev. Case served Three-in-One for ten years, he accepted a call to a deaf church in California. Three-in-One next called Rev. Donald Zuhn who accepted the call and began serving in 1991. During his seven years of service, Three-in-One moved out of the building on LaBranch and began using a conference room for worship at St. mark Lutheran Church in the Spring Branch area.

In November 1997, Pastor Zuhn retired from the Holy Ministry because of a stroke. In June of 1998, Three-in-One called Rev. Larry Lieder as pastor and he accepted the call. In November of that same year, Three-in-One moved into a house at 8311 Waterbury Street which the members remodeled into a church. God has blessed Three-in-One in the past and still continues those blessing today.

New Deaf Education Center Construction Makes Progress At Mill Neck Manor

Out of the serene snow that blankets beautiful Mill Neck, Long Island, something incredible is arising out of the ground. On Mill Neck Manor School for the Deaf's campus, a long-time dream is coming true. A state of the art Deaf education facility is in the middle of construction. The scheduled completion date for the Deaf Education Center (DEC), June 2001, coincides with the school's 50th Anniversary. The Mill Neck Manor community will celebrate its fine tradition of Deaf education while marking the beginning of even more innovative roads in teaching Deaf children.

Students and staff are excited to see the visible progress being made on the DEC. Week by week, students see more and more of the \$11 million building project go up right before their eyes. First came the ground breaking. Then the foundation was laid. Soon enough, the steel beams went up, and currently, the outer walls are being put in place and framework for the roof is being constructed. In an article written for a student newsletter, Mill Neck Manor high school student James "Reno" Edwards writes, "The new building has new technology and more...It's cool to see men walking on the steel...I'm looking forward to go into the new building."

The school, which was formerly a Long Island Gold Coast estate, rests on 86 acres and is housed in the grounds' Manor House and farm buildings. Students have attended classes in these buildings since the school's birth in 1951. As the years have gone by and the school buildings have become outdated, Mill Neck Manor required new facilities to ensure it offers the best possible education to its students.

The idea for the DEC first arose in 1991. The New York State Department of Education contributed \$8 million to the \$11 million project. Designed to match the look of other Tudor-style buildings on campus, the 44,000 square foot, 2-story building will house students from the Infant-Toddler program to the senior class of the high school. It is the first time all the students will be together in one building. The DEC will boast of new computer labs, 24 modern classrooms, a 220seat auditorium, cafeteria, therapy rooms, art studio, media room and library.

Aside from physical construction, the Mill Neck Manor family is also thrilled over the sense of community the new facility is creating. Local businesses and residents generously have contributed monetary and in-kind donations. The Dolan Family Foundation is matching every donation dollar-for-dollar up to \$500,000. In addition, Barnes and Noble recently donated bookshelves and furniture and granted Mill Neck Manor a generous amount of books for the DEC's library. The staff at Mill Neck Manor have also worked hard at various fundraisers including participation in a shopping benefit at Bloomingdales and a Game Show Night.

As the DEC comes closer to completion, it is not just another new building. "What we learn and do here on this campus is shared with programs and schools in other locations. Mill Neck Manor is more than just a set of buildings in a particular place – it is a mission of

caring and striving and sharing what we learn with others who wish to help God's people who are Deaf," said Dr. Mark Prowatzke, Executive Director of Mill Neck Manor.
