### Mrs. Lydia "Marie" (Seebach) Waters...

The following text was sent to D/L from Mrs. Waters' daughter, Nancy Abbott:

"When she (Marie) was at the hospital, she was unable to communicate with me (Nancy) as her hands were tied down and her mouth had tubes in them. I quickly told her to communicate by squeezing my hand with her left hand. During our conversation, she began to raise her hands towards the ceiling and her eyes opened wide (they were previously half closed). She never took her eyes off whatever she was seeing so I realized she was onto something important.

I asked her if she was seeing angels, to which she responded with a squeeze. I asked her how many were there, then she spelled '1', '2', which she squeezed again to indicate there were two angels.

I asked her if she saw her parents, another squeeze. I then made a personal remark that only my grandmother and I would understand to which my mother squeezed again hard. I then asked her if her other children (my siblings who she miscarried after I was born) were there. She squeezed again. I then asked her how many, with '1', '2' and '3', which she squeezed.

She became frustrated as she tried to sign 'God', then lifted her other hand, finger spelling 'L' to which I asked if she was seeing the Lord. She squeezed my hand again. I then asked her if what she was seeing beautiful, another squeeze.

Shortly before she died, I asked her if she could now hear (she had been born deaf). She squeezed again. I asked her if it was beautiful hearing all the sounds. She squeezed again with shinning eyes.

She passed on shortly after this, but her body which had been in so much pain, was suddenly peaceful. As I embraced her and then lifted my head, I saw a faint mist leaving her body in a fastevolving whirlpool. I then realized I was seeing her spirit leaving her body. As I backed away, I felt the gentle breeze of the angels leaving the room.

All this was also witnessed by a friend of mine who was there with them so I know I did not imagine it at all.

The following week she sent me a message when I turned on my car and a song by my favorite signer, Barbara Streisand came on, signing 'Happy Days Are Here Again'. I was blue prior to getting into the car, but realized she was telling me she was happy and I should be happy also. Last week, I remembered that my mother once told me that she was nicknamed 'Happy' in the MN School for the Deaf so this firmed what she was trying to tell me."
