Do you sometimes get bored? What do you do then? When I was a kid, my Mom would make me go into the bedroom and clean my room when I got bored. John 21:1-14 is about some disciples who got bored and went fishing.

Peter convinces his buddies: Thomas, Nathaniel, James and John, and two other disciples to go fishing with him. The seven of them go fishing together. They leave together and fish all night catching nothing.

Let us back track. After Easter Jesus sent them to Galilee. Jesus told them to go there and wait for Jesus [Matthew 28:10]. They are to meet Jesus there. While they are waiting and waiting and nothing happens. Peter gets the brainy idea of going to do something. In those days there was no TV to sit and watch. There was no golf, baseball, or game-boys to do while waiting. So finally Peter decides to go fishing.

Instead of fishing off the bank like me, they get into a boat. Most of these disciples are former fishermen. For three years, they lived as students attending seminary. Judas was the treasurer. Jesus was the professor. Jesus taught and Judas collected money. He paid for their daily needs. No problems for 3 years.

Now they have lost Judas as he committed suicide. And Jesus has risen from the dead but he appears and disappears at will [Mark 16:9-15]. No one is around to take care of their daily needs any more.

So, Peter decides while waiting that they needed to do something. Either out of boredom or out of financial need. They did what they knew best. They knew how to fish. So, Peter and the other six disciples go off and fish.

They are off on their own. No one to be there with them. No Lord Jesus to direct their activities. They are alone without Jesus.

Many of us are like that. We are off on our own without Jesus to direct our lives. We decide what we want to do and when we want to do it.



Hold unfailing your love for one another, since love covers a multitude of sins. 1 Peter 4:8

We are kind of like the Hebrews when they were wandering in the desert for 40 years. We are kind of like people Jesus said are like sheep without a shepherd. We are lost. We have no plan.

The disciples were told about the plan [Matthew 28:18-20]. Jesus told Peter that he would become a fisherman of people not fish [Mark 1:16-17]. Now Peter was back catching fish not people. Peter got lost. He forgot the plan. This is God's Plan – not our plan.

Jesus shows up and gives them the fish they need to catch. The Bible says they caught 153 fish. Not just regular fish but l-a-r-g-e fish. This will take care of the money they are worried about. God takes care of the disciples. He will take care of you.

The disciples needed to put their lives in God's hands. God will take care of them. They need not be like sheep without a shepherd [Mark 6:34].

In the same way, you do not need to worry about if you have enough money or not. God will take care of you. One way or the other.

Jesus tells Peter and the disciples, that God has a plan. Their plan is to become missionaries. They are to tell the world about Jesus, Good Friday, and the Resurrection, and the Church. They are to carry out Matthew 28, which is the Great Commission.

You too are a part of God's Plan. You are to carry out the Great Commission. You are to tell others about Jesus. But you will do it in your language, the language of sign.

God will take care of you and God has a plan for your life. Maybe you will need to wait until He tells you His plan. Maybe you already know His plan for your life. Maybe you will ignore His plan. Jonah ignored His plan. Jonah ran away. But later Jonah got back on track. Jesus knew God's plan. Jesus died on the cross. Later Peter did. He went to Rome and preached and died on a cross. Peter asked to be crucified up-side-down.

Let us pray to ask God to lead us to know and do His plan for our lives. It maybe a great and wonderful plan. It may be a plan that people will instantly applaud. It may be a plan that no one on earth recognizes but the angels in heaven applaud [Luke 15:7].

Article XIV THE LAW COMMITTEE

Section A — Purpose

The general purpose of the Law Committee is to evaluate situations and resolutions, study the Constitution and the Handbook and then make recommendations to the Board of Directors for changes that will improve the operations, business and activities of the ILDA.

Section B — Membership

The Law Committee shall consist of the president-elect and two (2) ILDA members from his/her own city/church nominated by him/her and approved by the president.

Section C — Procedure

- 1. All recommendations shall be mailed to each member of the Board of Directors by the chairman of the Law Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the next Board meeting.
- 2. At that Board meeting, the Board shall review the recommendations and act upon them.
- 3. All Handbook changes shall be sent to *The Deaf Lutheran* for printing so that all the members can read the changes.

Section D — Meetings

- 1. If the ILDA president-elect (with the prior written approval of the ILDA president) thinks there is a good reason to hold a Law Committee meeting, he/she shall call a meeting at least forty-five (45) days prior to the next Board meeting at a place convenient to the members of the Law Committee.
- 2. Law Committee meetings shall be at the expense of the ILDA and shall include travel, lodging, meals and ground transportation costs of the members.



Article XXV *THE DEAF LUTHERAN* Section A — Purpose

The Deaf Lutheran's main purpose is to publish news of interest to deaf Lutherans of the ILDA and its regional branches and to promote the broad interests of The Lutheran Church–Missouri Synod.

Section B — Editor

The editor is responsible for:

a. Editing the news stories and other articles that are contributed and prepare the publication for printing.

Article XVIII THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE Section A — Membership

The Nominating Committee shall be composed of all past presidents. The immediate past president shall be the chairman.

Section B — Responsibilities

- 1. The Nominating Committee shall request nominations for candidates for all the ILDA offices from the regional branches and from the congregations.
 - a. The requests for nominations shall be mailed to the secretary of each regional branch by the chairman of the Nominating Committee at least two months before the scheduled regional meeting. The regional secretary shall remind the congregations to offer name for nomination which shall then be voted on at the regional conference.
 - b. Candidates nominated need not be from within the region nominating them.
 - c. Only one candidate for each office may be nominated by a region.
 - d. Candidates shall be nominated in regions at their conference and chosen by a majority vote.
 - e. Deadline for nominations shall be the last day of February in the year of the ILDA convention, and nominations shall be submitted to the chairman of the Nominating Committee by the secretary of each regional branch.
 - f. Nominations received after the deadline cannot be considered by the Committee but can be re-offered at the convention.
- 2. The Nominating Committee shall obtain a biography and a photo of all candidates who agree to run for office and shall publish them in the Summer issue of *The Deaf Lutheran* (deadline May 1st) before the ILDA convention.

Section C — Replacement

If for any reason the immediate past president is not available the Board of Directors shall elect another past president to serve as the chairman of the Nominating Committee.

- b. Annually preparing the publication schedule and informing all parties concerned of its deadlines.
- c. Give regular reports to the ILDA Board of Directors regarding the publication.
- d. Work closely with the ILDA president and the Board for Mission Services representative in planning news stories and articles of interest.
- e. Attend all Board of Directors meetings at the expense of ILDA and attend Executive Council meeting(s) at the written request of the ILDA president.

Deaf Pah! - DIT - Leadership Training for Deaf People

Praying for your Pastor...

The great evangelical leader of the 1800's Dwight L. Moody, once said, "Every great movement of God can be traced to a kneeling figure."

Praying regularly for your pastor can have a spiritual impact on your church's place in God's plan.

Pastor Larry Harrold of Center Baptist Church says, "Pastor's are human, and are susceptible to distraction, discouragement and disappointment. Pastors want to be walking with Christ, but just like everyone, can find themselves drifting away while busy doing 'God's work'."

Here's a "Weekly Guide" to praying for your pastor:

Sunday: Pray that God will use your pastor as he shares from the pulpit what God is teaching him. Pray that he will proclaim the Word of God clearly and without distraction.

Monday: Pray that your pastor will rest and spend the time with his family in order to be an effective husband and father.

Tuesday: Pray for your pastor's sermon preparation – that he will have wisdom and insights from God.

Wednesday: Pray for your pastor to have a harmonious relationship with the church staff and church leaders.

Thursday: Pray for your pastor's physical and emotional health.

Friday: Pray for your pastor's spiritual growth.

Saturday: Pray that your pastor will be protected from the enemy of his soul.

Pastor Steve Walters, Associate pastor at Christ Community Church put it succinctly: "Pastors don't always take the time they should to pray for themselves, it's wonderful when their church people are praying for them."

LENT...

People often ask "What does Lent mean?" Why do we have Lent?"

Here are a few details.

Color - Purple = Purple is the color of repentance, sorrow, and mourning Date - Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, 40 days before Easter

Lent is a word meaning "springtime." In the early church the term of forty days was chosen because at the beginning of His ministry Christ went off into the wilderness for forty days to prepare. Lent was the time for new converts to prepare for their baptism, which happened on Easter. Later it was connected to people coming back to faith, and finally for all Christians as a time of fasting, and self-sacrifice.

The day before Lent began was Shrove Tuesday for the word "shrive," meaning to give or receive absolution. Since Lent was a time of self-denial, people did not eat meat, butter, eggs, cream, and other goodies. These were all used in a feast called Fat Tuesday, or Mardi Gras. Pancakes were often made from the butter, cream and eggs.

Lent is now a time of repentance, focusing on faith, prayer, fasting, rebirth and renewal, and of thinking about the meaning of Christ's life, death, and the salvation He gives us.

Lent includes Palm Sunday or Passion Sunday. Holy Week, which began in the 4th century, looks at the last week of Jesus' life. Maundy Thursday comes from the Latin "mandatum, meaning command and refers to John 13:34 -" new commandment I give to you, that you love one another." Thursday is the day Jesus shares the Passover meal with His disciples and begins the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

At the end of Worship on Maundy Thursday the altar area (chancel) is stripped of paraments and other decorations. It is left bare until the first worship on Easter. This year, you celebrate Lent, remember and thank God Jesus suffered and died for your sins. Sacrifice (give up) your time for Bible Study, prayer, and sharing Jesus love with everyone in your life.
