From the President



Happy Spring!!

Now, Spring is here at last! Up north, after a long and freezing winter, snow and ice are finally melting and all gone! Now, those who live in Northeastern states

(Massachusetts, New York, Maine, Pennsylvania, Vermont, Connecticut, etc.) must be grateful for the spring and enjoying the smell of blooming trees and flowers after surviving the worst gigantic winter storms this year! As for the rest of the country and Canada, we can enjoy the beauty of God's creation by smelling the fragrance of flowers and blooming trees, feeling the cool breeze on our faces, etc. As for us Texans, we are enjoying beautiful Texas Blue Bonnet all over our lands, fields, etc.

This year, we celebrated Easter on April 5th (which was also my husband, Mark's, birthday that was really a "double-special day" - joining with the day that we celebrated Jesus rising from the dead!) We went to worship at our church, Bethany Lutheran, and our new pastor, Rev. Danner's sermon on that day was about the most dangerous lies that are the ones we believe because we don't know they're not true. The TRUTH is that sin has consequences, and we can't escape consequences. Every act of sin is an act of rebellion against God and required the death of His Son. No sin is small. We are truly responsible for our actions and reactions. Finally, the best news is that the blood of Jesus is sufficient to cover any and every sin. No sin is too big for God to forgive. God's grace is always greater than our sin! Amen! According to Pastor Danner, while Satan is the father of all lies, Jesus is the TRUTH! Jesus gives us a new life through resurrection! (Matt. 28:1-7, 11-15)

From the Pastoral Advisor



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On April 12 the sermon I preached for the 2nd Sunday of Easter was about "Doubting Thomas" based on John 20:19-31 at Trinity Deaf

Lutheran Church, Vancouver, B.C. Canada. The theme was "What Do You Believe?" It explained that people believe what they perceive. We still see this happen all the time. Most of us know things are not always what they seem in the media, on the Internet, in the junk mail like scams we get. Should we be a "Doubting Thomas"? Someone who won't take what you say on trust? Someone who has to see it for themselves before they believe what you're saying?

I have been agonized by someone's comment that s/he prefers hard proof before s/he really believes in it. It becomes common that more people are like jurists who make a final verdict for themselves. How sad more people have lacked trust beyond their own belief! It is a new society of narcissists here and there.

My brother in Christ named Walter just shared an interesting article from the National Post, a popular Canadian-wide newspaper featuring "The Urban Consequences of Vanishing Churches". I read that thoroughly with care and I found some shocking news of how the Canadian churches are vanishing. The synagogue in Ottawa had to be closed in the progress of being demolished for commercial space and residential condos.

Incidentally, faith groups are the second real-estate holder in Canada, so thousands have been sold, converted to new uses, or demolished, and an estimated 9,000 more will be on the chopping block in the next few years. There are big social consequences: places of faith often meet an array of community needs beyond their spiritual mission like soup kitchens, shelters and low-cost space for non-profit partners. St. John The Divine Anglican Church in Victoria, BC uses its building to meet the needs of the inner city, providing shelter for homeless youths and older street folk, offering an emergency food supply, and providing meeting place to lesbians and gays. It has been blessed in return, signing a 10-year lease with Pacific Opera Victoria, which will use St. John the Divine's parish hall and invest in improving the facility.

This article made me think of vanishing deaf churches last decades as the older Lutherans passed away and the younger generation have not attended in growth. We have to rent some local gatherings in order to pay for the building bills and we are showing a bigger heart to donate more than how much we can afford to pay. Only God knows our generous hearts and let Him control our church situation in the future. Pray harder and have a wholesome prayer in a group.

We are looking forward to attending the next International Lutheran Deaf Association conference in Madison, Wisconsin on July 23-26. We hope you can join us. We are praying to God for the committee's wishful plan for Madison in the name of Jesus Christ. See you there this summer and have a safe blessed trip.

Sigatoka Special Education School Mission

I have had many people ask me why I decided to adopt a school in Fiji as "my mission." Perhaps if I tell you a little bit about myself it will clarify my thinking. I was born as a normal, overactive, chatty child into a family with a hard-of hearing mother and a deaf father. I have aunts, uncles, cousins who are also deaf, so it was our life and as normal as any other life.

My parents, Elmer and Mildred Francisco, were loving parents who took us to church and modeled the life a Christian should lead. I grew up in the deaf culture, spent many hours in the company of deaf family and friends. As an adult, God called me to interpret for three deaf friends living in my community, who did not have a deaf church to attend. I interpreted church services, Bible study and church meetings for 10+ years.

I was blessed to be called a teacher and I taught school for 17 years. I also spent a year as an interpreter in a public school for two deaf children. At that time I "got to learn" SEE sign, which is what they wanted me to use. After my years of teaching I became an elementary school principal. My heart is for children. They have been a source of humor, they amaze me and I never doubt what they can achieve.

Two years ago my husband and I, who are now retired, traveled to Fiji. This year will be our third trip there and I cannot express the joy it gives us to be with these loving, unselfish, humble, Christian (for the most part) people. Last year I learned about a special education school and heard that they have deaf children attending. So to satisfy my curiosity, I went to visit. The school had 55 students, 5 teachers and a principal. The students have a range of disabilities—deafness, blindness, Down's Syndrome, Autism, seizure disorder, etc.

I was shocked at the lack of materials and supplies for the teachers. I was also stunned that there was no additional adult help for the teachers. There is no way in the United States that teachers of special students with these type of disabilities would not have many adults at their disposal to help and the supplies necessary to do their job. Imagine trying to teach deaf children when you don't know their language (Auslan) and don't have the books from which to learn. The lack of materials and lack of help were my first two concerns.

After wrestling with what I could do, I decided I could tell others about this school and tell them that we can help supply them with the things they need materially. I finally turned it over to God because He knows I don't like to ask people for money. I have been so blessed to receive more cash and other supplies than I could have really hoped for. So now others are doing my work of getting the word out and this thing is growing. I trust that those who hear are moved to help will do so. I am going to spend 2 days a week at the school as a volunteer. Won't that be fun and interesting?

Jennifer Ceyanes' Mission Trip to China



Jennifer Ceyanes from Jesus Lutheran Church for the Deaf (JLCD) in Austin, TX will be serving in volunteer missions with the deaf in Macau, China for four weeks beginning April 27, 2015. She

previously was sent there by the LCMS World Mission from 1998 to 2000. She served in the deaf school with students ages 4 to 22 and in the local deaf community. Her work included leading morning devotions, teaching Bible stories, leading several Christmas and Easter dramas, having a girls group and a large student fellowship group. Jennifer had to learn the Chinese Sign Language quickly so she could communicate with the deaf. By the time she left she was fairly fluent.

These deaf children are all grown up now. Some are married and have children of their own! Jennifer will be returning to work with them as adults, reteaching the Bible and reminding them of God's love for them. One of the things Jennifer will be doing is teaching a Parenting Class for her previous students who have children. Also some of her previous students no longer attend church or Bible Study so she hopes to meet them again and encourage them to return to the Lord. There will also be Bible studies, gatherings, and workshops in an attempt to get everyone together again in order to hear God's Word through their own sign language.

JLCD is supporting this mission trip along with the help of other brothers and sisters in Christ. Your prayers are needed and greatly appreciated.

Signed Worship Part of Multicultural Congregation

Worshipers speak many different languages at Christ Lutheran Church, located in Woodside, NY in the New York city borough of Queens -- Spanish, Chinese French, Urdu, Bengali, English, "and whatever other languages are represented at that particular time," says the Rev. Dr. Joshua Hollmann.

But despite any lingual ebb and flow at this multicultural congregation, the 11 a.m. service always includes sign language, ensuring that a core group of worshipers who are deaf "hear" the Gospel in their own special way.
