Carol Seeger welcomed everyone to the 23rd Biennial Convention of International Lutheran Deaf Association (ILDA). She introduced two hosts from Our Savior Lutheran Church for the Deaf, Dawn and Greg Werth. They did a good job.

Necrology:

Diane Francisco, the chairman for Necrology shared an obituary report of Lee Ann Kotal who recently passed away and Lee Ann received her Right Hand Award from the ILDA convention in Austin, Texas in 2013. Pastor Mark Seeger led a prayer for those who passed away.

Invocation:

Pastor Greg Desrosiers led the opening prayer.

Nominating Committee's Report: Jeff Padon reported to nominate.

Minutes of the Previous Convention:

David Brown moved to accept the minutes as corrected from the 2013 ILDA Convention business meeting. Seconded by Larry Ginter. **Passed**

Treasurer's Report: (Please see attached)

Diane Munoz moved to accept the Treasurer's report. Seconded by Jeff Padon. **Passed**

Auditors:

Jon Holland (Ames Iowa) and Richard Lee (Des Moines, Iowa) Positive comments were received from the auditors.

President's Report:

- Carol Seeger welcomed everyone.
- Thanked the chairpersons, Dawn Polzin Werth and Greg Werth and the planning committee of Our Savior Lutheran Church of the Deaf for hosting the 2015 ILDA convention and for their hard work in planning the convention. They only had 1 year and 8 months to plan this convention. Carol thanked Peace Lutheran Church of the Deaf in Fort Wayne, Indiana for accepting the 2017 24th Biennial ILDA convention. For 2019 the ILDA convention will be in Topeka, KS but the Board needs a formal letter of a bid from them.
- Carol apologized for not attending any ILDA regional conferences in the past two years. It was due to two reasons. There was her illness with abscessed pneumonia and the soaring cost of airline fares. She admits she was really disappointed as she was eagerly looking forward to it.
- Mission project chairperson- Carol regretfully informed the ILDA attendees that Pam Kane had to resign from her position as Mission Project chairperson due to her husband's health issues earlier this year, so Carol asked Dorene Sell to take over this responsibility and Dorene accepted.
- As some of you may notice that there is no Scholarship Fund chairperson at this time. Carol admitted that she did forget to appoint someone for this position. Carol apologized. There is a shrinking number of Deaf churches in USA (about only 12 deaf churches left) and LDMS (Lutheran Deaf Mission Society) is responsible for earning funds for DIT (Deaf of Institute Theology). Carol suggested that ILDA members discuss this issue of the scholarship position and decide whether or not to keep or eliminate it from the bylaw book during new business.
- Even though the overall total of all funds for Mission Projects has met the goal for 2013-2015, Patrick Sell (Pro-Tem) treasurer continues to collect extra funds and put them in the ILDA treasury to go toward Mission Projects for 2015-2017.
- Upon Carol's meeting with Pastor Eckert, he explained briefly what LDMS did with the remaining funds, on foreign countries such as India and Ghana. The project is on hold for now since there are pending government issues.
- ILDA-\$1,580.71 funds from the Deaf Lutheran newsletter have been transferred from ILDA to Deaf Lutheran manager, Jeff Padon.
- There was a \$2,130.18 overage from the convention fund from 2013 ILDA convention in Austin. It went to the ILDA general fund, instead of the next ILDA convention and it is according to the bylaws book. Carol would like to add that

all of the executive officers are strongly encouraged to get familiar with the bylaws book. (see Article XX convention, Section E- Financing ILDA conventions b. Convention Registration Acct. #2)

- Several of us are concerned about the future of ILDA due to the shrinking number of deaf churches and ILDA regions. Carol mentioned that if regional leaders support and donate to ILDA then ILDA will be stronger. We want to keep ILDA active and alive.
- After receiving and using Mission Project funds, each recipient should give a report to ILDA.

Pastoral Advisor's Report (Pastor Gregory Desrosiers)

- During his two year term it was his privilege to serve God and Deaf Lutherans.
- Fortunately, the 2013-2015 officers did a good job at corresponding with each other via email.
- For the next term (2015-2017) let's implement with video phone (ooVoo) or other new program to have an online conference rather than flying to faraway hosts due to rising costs of airfare. (Last year, I could not make it to the Executive Board meeting due to the teacher's strike.)
- For the Deaf Lutheran newsletter, I found writing article a challenge because my thinking process took time to write down. He thanked Janet Gelhbach to remind him for deadlines for publishing the newsletter article.
- Pastor Greg thanked his faithful wife, Linda, to support him through the thick and thin air for years.

Synodical Representative's Report (Pastor Tim Eckert)

- Pastor Eckert reported that he was installed as the new director of LDMS in November 2014 since Pastor Konkel retired on June 30, 2014.
- In 2014, the ILDA Board said the Deaf ministry directory needed to be updated. Pastor Eckert and Janet Gehlbach did a lot of work on it. The updating of the congregations is done and is on <u>www.deafjesus.org</u>. All the information still needs to be formatted for printing.
- LDMS is beginning to do more work in encouraging interpreted ministries. Pastor Eckert will continue to encourage deaf congregations and provide resources for them. Districts have cut support for deaf congregations. Debbie Larson is our new project leader for Interpreted Ministry Support.
- LDMS continues to work on revising Deaf Pah. Work is slow since some pastors are not finishing their assigned classes and Reverend Jerry Munz resigned as project leader of Deaf Pah.
- Pastor Eckert is excited about expanding program for deaf children for deaf churches and hearing churches. He discussed about mission projects. (FIJI, David Bush, Macau etc.)
- DIT student Becky Catchpole will graduate next spring and she has received her call. It will be here in Madison, Wisconsin.

- A new deaconness student from St. Louis will start her classes in the fall of 2015 and more new students will start.
- Wisconsin has been a good supporter of DIT with four students.
- A St. Louis congregation wants to be active in deaf ministry. Next year one student will start and then several more will start later.
- Thanked ILDA for its partnership with LDMS.
- To take Deaf Pah classes a student needs to work with a mentor (Pastor).
- In addition Pastor Eckert wanted to say about DIT to please continuing supporting the students. If no students graduate what would happen in the future? NO Deaf Ministry in future!
- Deaf Pah there are 6 deaf people taking classes right now. Donna Madewell-Smith is the coordinator. There are four classes per year and it is required to attend at St. Louis for a workshop once a year.

The Deaf Lutheran Publication Report:

Pastor Daryl Gehlbach and Janet Gehlbach reported about *The Deaf Lutheran* Newsletter. The newsletter is folded in half way for a cheaper postage cost. It prints 4 times per year. It is available free on-line. A thermometer was put into the newsletter to show the growth of donations of ILDA Mission Projects. Most likely convention minutes will be printed in the November issue. If you want to subscribe to *The Deaf Lutheran* the cost is \$10 per year. There is an ad in the back of the 2015 ILDA program book and it has Jeff Padon's address in there to mail the subscription.

The Deaf Lutheran Business Manager Report

Jeff Padon said Rev. Ron Friedrich and Mark Friedrich take care of the labels for The Deaf Lutheran. When Janet emails him the file for the issue to print he emails it to the printer. Small world the printer is a member of an LCMS church. If Jeff cannot pick up the copies from the printer then it is mailed to his home. Funds for The Deaf Lutheran were sent from Patrick Sell to Jeff Padon. The balance is \$1,927.94 as of June 30, 2015. A full page ad for The Deaf Lutheran was put into the 2015 ILDA convention program book. Bulk mail cannot be used for sending The Deaf Lutheran because it requires a minimum of 200 addresses. Right now it is around 100 addresses being sent first class mail. When a subscription is expired a "last issue" label is put on the back page of the newsletter. Some older people do not have computers and they prefer a paper copy of The Deaf Lutheran. A question was asked if The Deaf Lutheran can be sent via email. The answer is yes but it is too risky to do it that way. Due to time constraints ILDA attendees were asked to talk to Jeff Padon after the business meeting for any questions related to The Deaf Lutheran newsletter.

- B. Rev. Mark Seeger reported on the Deaf Youth Service Trip to San Francisco, CA on June 23 to 30, 2015. Six deaf teens and three adults went on the mission trip. Mark did a power point presentation showing pictures and explain what they did (helped on church farm, worked at a soup kitchen, helped at assistant living center, Habitat for Humanity store, and beach clean). Mark thanked ILDA for their support in the youth service trips.
- C. Denise Pulfer thanked ILDA for support for the Madison VBS project.
- D. Becky Jungklaus thanked ILDA for support for St. Paul Lutheran Church, Wallis TX VBS project.

Mission Project Chairperson's Report: Dorene Sell

- 1. Dorene received a request from Pastor Mark Seeger for \$5,000 for Deaf Teen Service Trip.
- Pastor Eckert reports about two new seminary student funds and may request for two more new students in the future. \$7,000
- Dorene received a request from Patty Woodworth for Sigatoka Special Education School (special needs/deaf students) in Fiji. \$5,000
- 4. Pastor Desrosiers requested to amend each new DIT student \$16,000.

David Brown moved to accept all three mission projects and the amendment. Seconded by Albert Moore. **Passed.**

- A. Previous Convention committee chair: Jennifer Ceyanes explained about 2013 ILDA Convention at Concordia Texas University. It went well. 84 people attended the convention. There were a variety of workshops and everyone had a great time. The convention had \$2,261.45 that was sent to Patrick Sell for the ILDA General Fund.
- B. Special committee reports: None

Alan Rork reported that Peace Lutheran Church for the Deaf, Indianapolis submitted a bid for the next 24th Biennial ILDA convention in 2017. The bid was accepted and the convention will be at Fort Wayne, Indiana at Concordia Theological Seminary July 20-23, 2017. Attendees have a choice of staying at a local hotel or staying at the seminary dorm.
