From the President



Greetings to you in the name of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Amen! Recently in May I went to the Lutheran Deaf Mission Society (LDMS) Board meeting. We discussed the budget, international missionaries (Kenya, India,

Ghana and Macau) and voted to approve Rev. Tim Eckert's mission to Kenya. As the ILDA President and together with the LDMS President, we both acknowledged and agreed to the same common goal: to spread the Good News (Gospel) about Jesus Christ. The meeting started at 12:45 p.m. CST and ended about 9:15 p.m. with an hour break for dinner. The meeting was held at Concordia Lutheran Church – Kirkwood, just southwest of St. Louis, MO (right on the historic route 66! How cool is that?)

In June, the Executive Council of ILDA decided that Concordia Theological Seminary at Fort Wayne, IN is not suitable for the 2017 convention due to the lack of accessibility for the physical disabilities and the difficulty in walking across the seminary campus for those who use walkers and canes. Most of the bathrooms are located in different levels throughout the campus. The buildings were built in the 1950s and this was before the ADA. I did have difficulty walking across the campus and climbing the stairways. I then realized about the other members who may have more severe difficulty than me. I know, I am not getting younger!

Rev. Alan Rork and the hard working host committee already have "Plan B" for the 2017 ILDA convention. It will be in a hotel located in Indianapolis probably near the international airport and has a shuttle available for transport to the hotel. Our number one priority is the safety of the older members especially those who rely on their walking assistance devices (i.e. walkers, canes, wheelchairs and/or scooters). We do not want to restrict you but give you equal access to attend the ILDA convention We want to welcome you all to come regardless. It will be July 20-23, 2017 in Indianapolis. Youth Service Trip 2016

Five deaf youth and two adult chaperones from Deaf Youth Ministry of Texas went with Pastor Mark Seeger to Seattle, WA for a week to perform service projects for other people. The first service project was at Elk Run Farm in Maple Valley. The farm is growing vegetables for food banks and soup kitchens. Most of the work done was to prepare the soil for farming.



The second day they worked in a very steep wildlife area called Me-kwa-mooks. The purpose was to pull out invasive plants so the natural plants could grow and thrive.

The third project was at the host location, Seattle Lutheran High School. They did a lot of painting and changed the combinations on the lockers to get ready for the new school year. They were thankful the principal, David Meyer, allowed them to stay at the school. The last service project was at Lincoln Park, again removing invasive plants and trees so the natural plants could grow and thrive.



Each evening was spent in Bible Study. After worship on Sunday they saw the sights of Seattle: Pike Place Market, the "Gum Wall," the first Starbucks and a famous lighthouse. The next day they saw the Space Needle and the 4th of July fireworks.

Rev. Seeger wants to thank ILDA for sponsoring this trip with the mission project grant to Deaf Youth Ministry of Texas. They are in the process of looking for the location for the 2017 Service Trip. Family worship continues at Our Savior Deaf Church, Madison, WI

Do you think church is boring? NOT HERE! That has been our motto for the year when we started our family worship program. We wanted to reach out to families that have a deaf/hard of hearing child so that the child can finally learn about God's love in their own language.

We started in the summer of 2015 with classes once a month. In October we decided to continue testing and changing things to fit as we grew. We held a Christmas party for families in December and started a sign class in April. After a while we wanted to see how much we have grown and how things were going so we started keeping track of who came (this was also good follow-up on people who missed worship).

For spring 2016 here is what God has done:

- 35 adults and kids average per week
- 53 adults and kids was our largest count
- 12 different families came

23 volunteers came to help make this successful

103 people attended at least one time • One family came to know and understand God and His love. This summer their two kids will be baptized. One other family had their son baptized in June. For the summer we are starting an adult confirmation class so that parents will be able to teach their children at home too. We reach out not only to Lutherans but also Catholic, non-denominational and agnostic. One girl has had so much fun that she is bringing her adult cousin (who is agnostic) to the worship. This is a big step for the cousin. We are now in our summer program and having fun!
