Deaf Ministry in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya

If in May, 2016, you asked how much Deaf Ministry was happening in the Lutheran Church in Kenya, the answer would be "None." But now there are two congregations learning how to serve the Deaf and that can easily grow to dozens or more.

In 2015, Bishop Joseph Omollo from the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya (ELCK) visited the U.S. to raise money for the church's orphanage in Kisumu, Kenya. I met with him to discuss Deaf Ministry in Kenya and learned that the ELCK wasn't doing any work with the Deaf, but they were willing to learn.

In mid-June, 2016, I flew with my family and some members of their high school robotics team to Kenya. They stayed in Nairobi to teach robotics in local schools (that's a whole other story!) while I went to Kisumu for a week. What an experience! So many things were different – the buildings, food, roads, language, etc. But at the same time, it didn't feel very foreign. I think part of the reason was that Great Britain ruled Kenya for many years, so some of their culture is adopted from British culture and many of the people speak some English. Another reason is that many Kenyans say they are Christians and most of my time was spent with fellow Lutherans. Kenyans are also very welcoming and friendly. All those things helped to make my time there very enjoyable and pleasant.

Good mission work often takes some time to set up. A farmer cannot go into his field in May and pick ripe corn. He must prepare the soil, plant, cultivate, spray for weeds, and wait for the plants to grow and mature. Paul also talked about that in 1 Corinthians when he talked about different people planting and watering the Gospel. When I went to Kenya, I didn't know the church leaders, the Deaf, their sign language, how they are educated, where they live, etc. I went there to learn and see how the Lutheran Deaf Mission Society can help the ELCK teach and train the Deaf. I was hoping we could do more than that, but I wasn't expecting more.

God made the visit very productive! I learned a lot and we also made decisions to begin some work immediately. Only about 20% of the Deaf go to school. Most of the Deaf stay home and get no education. They have no language, only a few home signs, no Deaf community, no job, and no way to learn about Jesus. The most important thing they need right now is to learn a language. Then they can learn about Jesus, learn job skills, and talk to each other. But who will teach them? How about the 20% of the Deaf who do go to school? I visited three congregations and met about 150 people, 22 of them Deaf. There is a large number of Deaf people there! In each congregation, there was one person who had graduated from a Deaf school. You see how God provides? God put one Deaf person in each church who is ready to teach.

We made plans and two of the churches have begun the lessons. A pastor and deaconess in the ELCK are organizing everything. The Deaf and their families are

meeting every week to learn how to sign and also learning basic Bible stories. Eventually some of these Deaf will be trained as leaders. The long-term plans may also include a Lutheran Deaf School.

Praise God for the work that began there! Pray that the people do not become tired of meeting to study and learn. We began working in one little area of Kenya; there is much, much more work to do. Pray that Deaf Ministry will spread in the ELCK so more Deaf know Jesus as their Savior!

ILDA Executive Council Meeting Don Hall's Guesthouse Hotel, Fort Wayne, IN Friday, June 24, 2016

Announcements:

1. Karen Beiter requests everyone to send our membership dues to her as soon as possible.

2. Gregory Werth says "see you next year".

The meeting adjourned at 2:56 p.m. Closing prayer was led by Rev. Daryl Gehlbach.

The meeting was called to order at 9:01 a.m. by President John Mason. Rev. Gregory Desrosiers gave the opening prayer.

Roll Call:

President – John Mason President Elect – Gregory Werth Secretary – Janet Gehlbach Treasurer – Karen Beiter Pastor Advisor – Rev. Gregory Desrosiers LDMS Representative – Rev. Alan Rork (representing Rev. Tim Eckert)

Minutes

Secretary Janet Gehlbach informed the ILDA Executive Council that she will make some minor adjustments to the minutes from 2015. The ILDA logo will also be inserted.

1. Gregory Werth (Rev. Gregory Desrosiers) moved to accept the minutes of the Executive Council meeting on Wednesday, July 22, 2015 as read. Passed.

2. Rev. Gregory Desrosiers (Gregory Werth) moved to accept the minutes of the ILDA Board meeting on Thursday, July 23, 2015 as read. Passed.

3. The Executive Council recommended some changes to the minutes (name changes) of the Business Meeting on Friday, July 24, 2015. These minutes will be brought to the Business Meeting at the 2017 ILDA Convention for approval.

President's Report (John Mason)

1. Reported he went to the Lutheran Deaf Mission Society (LDMS) meeting on May 2 as part of the Board. On Saturday, May 21 he observed the LDMS Affiliated Congregation Meeting in the morning. ILDA and LDMS has the same goals of spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ to all deaf people. 2. He has concerns about the membership to ILDA. Because of what he observed at the Madison convention of people paying for their membership the same day and then voting without reading the Constitution or Handbook there needs to be regulations set up. He would prefer that people pay membership dues three months before a convention.

3. His goal is to expand ILDA and would like to send information about ILDA to interpreted church ministries.

4. He is concerned about member activity especially at the last convention in Madison, WI. Some people became members at the door and voted. He believes the law committee needs to review the membership issues.

5. He noticed attendance at ILDA conventions has varied. He has wondered what's wrong? Some people have said they prefer going to the Deaf Seniors of America conventions held the same year as ILDA.

6. He hopes to stay after the 2017 convention to attend Ephphatha Conference and hopes to inspire the pastors and church workers to reach out to the deaf who do not know Jesus Christ.

7. He worked on the nomination forms for the Right Hand Award and will be mailing them out to churches. Any nominations for the award should be sent to Becky Jungklaus by July 1, 2017.

8. Interpreted ministries will be encouraged to send their deaf members to the ILDA conventions.

9. He reported he needs a local engraver to engrave the plaque of the name of the Right Hand Award winner.

10. Gregory Werth suggested 30 days before the convention that nomination forms be copied and sent to the other Executive Council members to look over prior to making a decision of the winner.

11. Three people asked John to continue another term (two years) as President. This discussion will be put into new business.

12. Wanted to set up a special Distinction Award for past Executive Council officers. Guidelines would need to be set up for this. He showed some designs and will add the ILDA logo. More discussion on this issue will be in new business. The award would be presented at the banquet.

13. Has not received any bids to host the 2021 convention. He prays that someone will bring a bid to the convention next year. He plans to make a vlog to put in Facebook encouraging churches to make a bid. 2021 will be the 50^{th} anniversary of ILDA and he hopes to have a special 50^{th} Anniversary book prepared.

14. He will be asking Rev. Ron Friedrich to update the ILDA website. It needs to be changed and made more easily accessible.

President-Elect Report (Gregory Werth)

1. Will do his best to uphold his duties as President-elect for ILDA. He has been very busy since the Madison convention.

Attended the CR-ILDA convention in Cantrell, IL (near Springfield). It was a good convention and he was asked to be Parliamentarian. He was able to help make the voting process smoother for election of new officers.
 Feels the need to follow up with other regions to make sure they are following the by-laws and the order of meeting business guidelines. He hopes to meet with the presidents and the secretary's to make sure they understand the by-laws. The ILDA Handbook has some gray areas that need to be made clearer.

4. Would like to work on bids for the 2021 Convention by contacting churches or groups to see if they are willing to host. Did ILDA get a formal bid from the Topeka, KS group? He plans to contact them about it.

5. Diane Francisco gave him copies of the old ILDA Handbooks. He has been reading and researching them and hopes to make some changes to clear up some by-laws that will prevent problems down the road.

6. Regional realignment may be done depending on which deaf churches are still active and possibly adding interpreted ministries too.

Secretary's Report (Janet Gehlbach)

1. I helped Pastor Richard Moody update the State of Missouri Non Profit Corporation renewal for ILDA in January 2016. The bi-annual renewal was not done because Pastor Moody did not receive a renewal card so our nonprofit status expired. Janet had to sign some papers as Secretary of ILDA and Pastor Moody sent them to the Missouri Secretary of State. They were approved. Pastor Moody recently renewed again (deadline August 2016) and he is now the registered agent for ILDA so no more signatures will be required of ILDA officers. This recent renewal will be for two years.

2. I received a three ring binder from Becky Jungklaus that had Secretary stuff inside (minutes and other papers) from 2001 to the present. I am shocked that there are no other minutes from the years prior to 2001. My time has been spent contacting different pastors and laypeople who might have copies of the minutes. I inserted copies of the minutes that I had in my files from previous conventions that I attended. I will continue to search for the missing minutes (1973, 1977, 1979, 1985, 1987 and 1991). Mary Mowl, Rev. William Ludwig and Jackie VanManen have been a valuable resource in providing me with some missing minutes and program books. 3. I made suggestions for revisions to the ILDA Constitution and ILDA

Handbook. 4. I helped Rev. Tim Eckert with two projects since 2015. The first one was to update the LCMS Deaf Directory online and the second was to provide him a list of current interpreted worship churches and a list of churches that no longer provide interpreted services.

5. I have scanned all the ILDA minutes that I have so far into pdf files. Paper copies are being kept in the Secretary's binder.

6. I have scanned all the ILDA program books since 1971 into pdf files. John Mason was given a disk of the program books as well as a list of all the ILDA officers since 1971.

7. I would like to suggest the Executive Council have new photos taken during this meeting for the ILDA website.

8. I plan to keep a blank copy of the Right Hand Award nomination papers in the Secretary's binder for future reference for the next chairperson of the Right Hand Award.

Treasurer's Report (Karen Beiter)

1. In October 2016 Patrick Sell sent checks to deposit into new accounts that Karen opened.

2. \$ 4,875.13 is the total deposited for the Mission Projects since the last convention in Madison and \$50 deposited into the General Fund.

3. 2,000 in expenses were paid to Concordia Seminary for the Zacharias Fund.

4. There is a total of \$ 45,450.09 for both bank accounts (checking and savings).

5. There was some discussion on what ILDA will pay for officer's expenses going to meetings. Karen asked to let her know if anyone wants reimbursement for their room/mileage expenses.

6. Discussed the thermometer to be put into *The Deaf Lutheran* newsletter to show the progress in donations given for Mission Projects.

Pastor Advisor Report (Rev. Gregory Desrosiers)

1. Will try to keep his report K.I.S.S. (Keep It Simple and Short).

2. He brought a box from Rev. William Ludwig, Seattle, WA to give to Janet and Rev. Daryl Gehlbach that has back issues of *The Deaf Lutheran* newsletters. He reported attendance is down at Rev. Ludwig's church and he will soon retire.

3. Suggested that the ILDA Regions be re-done as there are many regions no longer active.

4. Concerned that a small number of Regional Presidents show up at the ILDA convention. Feels it is time to change the regions and need to change the by-laws to reflect those changes.

 Needs ILDA to be open to everyone, deaf and interpreted ministries with deaf members. It is time to be flexible and not be so strict like years ago.
 For example, welcoming gays and lesbians and teaching them the Bible.
 Interpreters should be welcome to attend ILDA conventions.

7. We need to roll up our sleeves and help each other.

LDMS Representative (Rev. Alan Rork representing Rev. Tim Eckert)

1. LDMS had the annual meeting at Concordia Lutheran Church, Kirkwood, MO. Representatives were there from Holy Cross Deaf, St. Louis, MO; Prince of Peace Deaf, Spring Lake Park, MN; Resurrection, Sunset Hills, MO; Concordia-Kirkwood, St. Louis, MO and Peace Deaf, Indianapolis, IN. Canvary Deaf, Des Moines, IA and Word of God Deaf, Cedar Rapids, IA did not send representatives.

2. Project leaders have been found for the following:

- DIT, Rev. Tim Eckert
- DeafPah, <vacant> resulting in revision of the classes not happening at the present time
- DeafLITES, Sara Hale
- Interpreted Ministry Support, Carissa Huffman and Chris Hamilton
- Ephphatha Conference, Rev. Daryl Gehlbach
- World Missions, Rev. Alan Rork
- Technology, Paula Willig

3. Andrew Petajan has applied to the DIT Program at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO. We have not heard yet if he has been accepted. Felitia Spencer's plans to enroll have been postponed to 2017 maybe. LDMS is thankful for ILDA's partnership in supporting DIT students. We want many more to enroll!

4. Rev. John Reinke and Rev. Tim Eckert have submitted a proposal to Concordia Seminary to run more of DIT ourselves. Pastors to the Deaf will do more of the teaching thus reducing the cost of tuition. We need to wait for the seminary to consider the proposal. Maybe Fall or Winter we might hear something.

5. Jennifer Ceyanes continues to work on the Sunday School lessons but progress is slow. Becky Jungklaus is making videos of teaching the lessons.

6. Rev. Eckert's report is being given by Rev. Rork because Rev. Eckert is in Kenya now with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya (ELCK) helping them do Deaf Ministry.

7. Funds for mission work in Ghana and Macau have been distributed. Rev. Ryan McDermott will be serving in Ghana and David and Barbara Bush will be serving in Macau.

8. Paula Willig has been active in posting things to the new Facebook page and creating a new website, <u>www.JesusDeaf.org</u>. This is a new website for sermons, Bible studies, classes, videos, any resources that LCMS churches or pastors want to share.

9. The LDMS Board is very glad to have John Mason on the Board. We are thankful for our working relationship with ILDA. LDMS will encourage interpreted ministries to become involved in ILDA and send their members to the conventions.

Committee Reports

1. The Deaf Lutheran newsletter report:

a. Janet and Rev. Daryl Gehlbach continue to serve as co-editors for *The Deaf Lutheran* (DL). This is their 4^{th} year as co-editors. Everything is going fine!

b. Subscriptions are down to 44 paid, 5 complimentary and about 10 sent to Canada. In 2013 there were 154 total paid subscriptions. One reason for this is the DL being available on-line.

c. Jeff Padon would like to step down as Business Manager at the end of 2017. He is willing to do the folding and mailing of the newsletters until then. Jeff has a long commute, 1 ½ hours in the morning and evening. The post office is closed when he gets home. Saturdays is the only day available for him to be able to go get stamps.

d. Rev. Ron Friedrich, Jeff Padon, Janet and Rev. Gehlbach have discussed the matter of readership. Many readers have made the transition to viewing the DL on-line for free. Some readers still prefer the printed version. One suggestion is to make the on-line version free, but charge ten dollars per year for those who wish to have a printed copy. This will keep printing costs down, yet allow for increasing the number of readers. The goal is to get the news out for people to read. The ILDA Executive Council should discuss this at its meeting.

e. The current issue of The Deaf Lutheran is available online, as well as issues going back to 1997. Rev. Gehlbach is in the process of scanning additional back issues for posting on the web. These can be found at www.deafjesus.org/ilda/DeafLutheran/DLhome.html.

f. John Mason is planning to ask Rev. Friedrich to have a "counter" added to the ILDA website so we can see how many people read or download the *Deaf Lutheran* newsletter.

g. John Mason suggested adding the *Deaf Lutheran* as a mission project. h. Rev. Daryl Gehlbach suggested having an email group called "ILDA Deaf News" for the purpose of receiving announcements, news, flyers, etc. relating to ILDA. Gregory Werth suggested using Mailchimp.com for the emails.

2. Business Manager report:

a. Jeff Padon, Business Manager for *The Deaf Lutheran* reported a balance of \$ 1,794.00 on January 1, 2015. Since then, income was \$1,417.45 and expenses were \$ 1,795.01. The balance on May 31, 2016 was \$ 1,416.44.

Lunch break at 12:15 p.m. Rev. Alan Rork gave the prayer for the noon meal.

At 2 p.m. The Executive Council and three members of the 2017 host committee toured Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, IN as the site for the next convention.

The meeting resumed at 4:59 p.m. at the hotel. Those in attendance from the host committee were Donna Madewell-Smith, Mike Ford and Rev. Alan Rork. Mike Moore is the chairperson but he was unable to come.

The Executive Council made some suggestions for changes to the schedule for the convention.

Discussion was done about making sure who can vote during the Business Meeting. Those paying for ILDA memberships at the door should not be allowed to vote. Members should pay their dues at least three months before the convention and have read the ILDA Constitution and Handbook.

Break for dinner at 6 p.m. Rev. Daryl Gehlbach offered the prayer before the evening meal.

The meeting resumed on Saturday, June 25 at 9 a.m.

3. 2017 Convention discussion:

a. The Executive Council feels that Concordia Theological Seminary is not an acceptable site for the 2017 convention and that the host committee should look for another site in Indianapolis. By having it in Indianapolis, the proposed trip to see the new Ark in Williamstown, KY will not be such a long trip compared to the trip from Fort Wayne.

b. Having the convention at a hotel will draw more people to attend.

c. Rev. Rork will contact Leeanna Rondot at the seminary to cancel the seminary site for 2017.

4. Law Committee:

a. The Executive Council went through the list of proposed changes to the Constitution and the Handbook.

b. Article XX in the Handbook should be re-written as there are too many gray areas.

c. There is nothing in the Handbook that says where the profit of the convention money should go. John Mason commented the host committee can decide what to do with the profit.

5. 2015 Madison Convention Report (Dawn Werth and Gregory Werth, co-chairpersons):

a. Wants to say a big "THANK YOU" for allowing the them to host the convention, to Carol Seeger and Jeff Padon for their persuasion to host, to the Lord for being on their side as they prepared, organized and hosted the convention, to Gregory for being so patient, hardworking and staying positive and fun throughout the whole planning process and taking caring of things with the hotel. Many thanks to the members of Our Savior Deaf (Madison), Emmanuel Lutheran Church (Milwaukee) and Holy Cross Deaf (Delavan) as they participated on the committee.

b. <u>Attendance</u>: There were 134 attendees at the convention. This count beat the Rochester, NY convention total!

c. <u>Hotel/Site/Food</u>: A big blessing to Crowne Plaza for their willingness to work with us and during the negotiations to get the right prices, selection of foods and rooms. There were few complaints but mostly about the sleeping rooms. Starbucks in the hotel lobby helped to draw people to buy their favorite drinks. We noticed deaf seniors prefer to stay in a hotel rather than a dorm or campground which brings up attendance numbers.

d. <u>Opening Night</u>: It went well and everyone seemed to enjoy the "Taste of Wisconsin." Everyone cooperated in being on time for the convention schedule and for the door prize drawings.

e. <u>God's 1000 Luncheon</u>: We wanted to bring this back to let members about God's 1000 Plan and hoping to have it again at future conventions.
f. <u>Workshops</u>: Everyone enjoyed the workshops, especially the Creation Museum and the small bookstore that allowed people to buy merchandise.
g. <u>Banquet</u>: The banquet was a huge success! The themed banquet was

well received and it was unique and informal. Attendees enjoyed the food served throughout the convention.

g. <u>Banners</u>: We had a good banner competition. Hearing judges were selected so there would be no bias in selecting the winner.

h. <u>Committee</u>: The committee was awesome and they were treated to a dinner after the convention as a way of thanking them for their hard work. i. <u>Financial Report</u>: The financial report is not finished yet but the convention received \$32,103.61 as income from registration fees,

donations and fundraising. Expenses were \$30,370.20 for conference room, rooms, food, supplies, printing, services, etc. Profit was \$1,733.41 which will be given to the ILDA Treasurer as soon as the financial report is completed and audited by two of their church members.

6. Mission Project report:

a. Is Dorene Sell still doing the duties for the mission projects? She will be responsible for finding mission projects for ILDA to support. Janet Gehlbach will see her in August at the Midwest ILDA conference and will find out of Dorene is still willing to do it. If she does not want to do it then John Mason will find another person to be responsible for the mission projects.

b. Those individuals or organizations receiving mission project funds in the past should be encouraged to come to the convention and present their

report on how the funds were spent. Dorene should ask those people to come.

c. At the next convention those individuals or organizations asking for money should explain to the attendees what the money will be used for before the voting begins. If there are no mission projects requests then it is possible to get recommendations from the floor on where to give mission project money to.

7. Right Hand Award:

a. John Mason has prepared the nomination forms and envelopes for mailing for the Right Hand Award. All nomination forms will be sent back to Becky Jungklaus. John Mason will ask her to scan the nomination forms received and they will be sent to the Executive Council before the next meeting in July 2017.

b. An engraver is needed to put the winner's name on the plaque.

c. John Mason will ask Rev. Friedrich to put the nomination forms on the ILDA website so it is available for the next person responsible for the Right Hand Award.

OLD BUSINESS

Updates:

1. Janet Gehlbach has scanned all the Secretary's minutes she has so far from 1971 to the present time. There are six conventions of which minutes are missing (1973, 1977, 1979, 1985, 1987 and 1991).

2. Financial reports have not been scanned.

 Training for new officers was not done during the 2015 Madison Convention. The Executive Council suggested that one-on-one training might be best for the next convention. Each out-going and in-coming officer should get together and share information of what their duties are.
 Mission project funds given out to recipients are required to give a report at the next convention of how they used the funds they received.

NEW BUSINESS

Some discussion was spent about possibly having a workshop on region realignment during the next convention and discussing the voting procedures that new members should go through orientation first before they are able to vote.

Motion **#1**: Rev. Gregory Desrosiers (Gregory Werth) moved to give out a Distinguished Service Award to a past officer of ILDA at any convention at the President's discretion with the Executive Council's approval. Passed.

Break at 10:48 a.m. for check out. Be back at 12:30 p.m.

Motion #2: Gregory Werth (Karen Beiter) moved to accept the attached Constitution revisions and send the revisions for review to ILDA members ninety (90) days prior to the 2017 convention. Passed. (These revisions will be printed in the 2017 February issue of the *Deaf Lutheran*).

Motion #3: Gregory Werth (Rev. Gregory Desrosiers) moved that new changes in the ILDA Handbook along with later changes to Article XX be voted on at the next Executive Council meeting. Passed.
