2024 ILDA convention report

The 27th Biennial ILDA convention was held July 11-14, 2024 at the DoubleTree by Hilton Hotel Detroit-Dearborn in Detroit, Michigan and was hosted by Our Savior Lutheran Church of the Deaf, Beverly Hills, Michigan. The theme for the convention was "Defending the Faith" based on 1 Peter 3:15 "Always be ready to give a defense to everyone who ask you a reason for the hope that is in you."

Convention co-chairs were Brian and Cynthia Smith-Byer. Their committee did a fantastic job planning for and running the convention. Waving hands to all

One mission project was approved for Lutheran Deaf Mission Society—Kenya for \$3.000. Additional funds received after the 2021-2024 mission project goal was completed will be applied to the 2024-2026 mission project.

Lutheran Deaf Mission Society approved to give St. Martin Lutheran School for the Deaf, \$2,500 for the purchase of five tablets to be used by those students during the school year.

During the banquet on Saturday evening, Rev. Daryl Gehlbach acknowledged pastor and church worker anniversaries with a power point presentation. There were several awards given out. The first one was the Right Hand Award given to David G. Brown and was presented to him by Janet Gehlbach, Right Hand Award Chairperson, for his service to his church. Rev. Edwin Bergstresser, Lutheran Deaf Mission Society Executive Director, presented "The Rev. William Ludwig Award" to Rev. Mark Seeger. The next awards were given as certificates of appreciation by the Great Lakes Region officers recognizing John Mason and Carol Seeger for their faithful service to ILDA as an officer and in the Great

LDMS established a new award to be given in recognition of professional church workers as selfless servants of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The new award is being given in honor of Rev.
