Prince of Peace Lutheran Church for the Deaf from Minneapolis, MN hosted the 2021 International Lutheran Church Association 25th convention in Chicago, IL. Attendance was around 75-80 people.

Lutheran Deaf Mission Society set up a new Award "The Rev. William Ludwig Award". The award recognizes professional workers as selfless servants of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Financial report and Convention report given.

Sara Hale (Diane Fransisco) moved to accept the minutes of the 2021 ILDA Chicago convention written. Passed

Treasurer's Report—(John Mason)

July 21, 2021, to June 20, 2024

One page report from John Mason is attached to the minutes.

Current membership 102 from 2023-2025. Two of the members have deceased. There are 26 of God's 1000 Club with \$520 donations.

All Missions Projects were met by July 1, 2023.

Checking account balance is currently \$1,167.58

Saving account balance is currently \$123,307.06

Zachariah Fund transferred \$5,000 from Savings to Checking. Three D.I.T. students received \$1,000 each in Fall 2023 and Spring 2024. This is a change from previous \$1,000 a year to \$1,000 a semester. Rev. Tim Eckert brought up the question about which part of the general fund is the Zachariah fund. After discussion it was noted that there is no known information.

Welcomed everyone to the 27th Biennial convention. World Deaf Missions-

India renovated the school and housing for deaf

Ethiopia asked for interpreter training and provided mattresses for girls' dorm. Work the meeting with prayer has been on hold due to war situation.

Kenya requests ILDA money for school children to attend. LDMS supports Pastor Adonis Luvisha to study and better serve deaf ministry. Rev. Eckert the Deaf Lutheran balances are hopes to visit Kenya this year or next year.
