What is Sin Anyway?

1 John 3:4-5 (ESV):

"Everyone who

makes a practice of sinning also practices lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. You know that he appeared in order to take away sins, and in him there is no sin."

What is, or What Do You Call, Sin? Whatever is

contrary to the law of God, or against the precepts of the Decalog, namely not only what is done in every deed, either outwardly or inwardly, but also whatever in our nature is not in conformity with the law of God.

The answer to the little question "What is sin?" makes most people uncomfortable and even upset. But Jesus came to save us from our sins. The problem is if we try to hide our sins or even say we don't have any sins, then we are pushing away our savior.

Instead of hiding from our sins or pretending they aren't there, let us learn what sin is so that we can confess our sins and receive forgiveness from Jesus.

There are two kinds of sin: actual and original. Actual sin is any thought, word, or deed against God, which means against the Ten Commandments. So take time to memorize these 10 commands so you can decide what is sin and what is not.

But there is also original sin. You received this sin from Adam. This sin is being born without the fear of God, without trust in God and with the inclination to sin. Paul calls this Adam's sin and says it works like a law in your members. Now know when you know your sin, confess it to God. For example: Lord I know I have not cared for my child like I should. I have harmed him with my words and not used my thoughts to help him. Please forgive me for the sake of Jesus and His death. Amen.

The more you know your sin and confess it, the more confidence you build on Jesus. Jesus doesn't want you to carry around the burden of your sin. Give it to Him and rest.

A summary of the minutes of the ILDA Executive Council Zoom meeting held July 23, 2020, is printed below. The full minutes, with all submitted reports, can be seen on the ILDA website: www.deafjesus.org/ilda.

The Executive Council meeting was called to order at 1:05 p.m. by President John Mason. Rev. Tyler Walworth gave the opening prayer. Roll call of officers were: John Mason, Gregory Werth, Janet Gehlbach, David G. Brown, Rev. Tyler Walworth and Rev. Ron Friedrich. Attending the meeting later were Carolyn Snyder-Mason, Dawn Werth and Rev. Daryl Gehlbach.

David G. Brown (Gregory Werth) moved to accept the Executive Council minutes of July 17, 2019 as read. Passed.

President's report (John Mason)

- Discussed different scenarios if ILDA dissolves because no host bid for 2023 has been received. ILDA members are encouraged to read the Constitution and Mission Projects (Carolyn Snyder-Mason) the Handbook regarding dissolution.
- Deaf Seniors of America (DSA) is one of the major ٠ conflicts with ILDA conventions. Discussed moving the ILDA convention to a different year.

President-elect report (Gregory Werth)

No report given but he sees a conflict between DSA and ILDA conventions.

Secretary report (Janet Gehlbach)

Signed renewal registration form for ILDA from the State of Missouri.

Treasurer report (David G. Brown)

- Discussed the status of a couple mission projects • (Texas Youth Ministry and Togo)
- Mission project donations so far is \$6,366.83. •
- Executive Council accepted David's financial reports. They will be audited prior to the Chicago convention.

Pastoral Advisor report (Rev. Tyler Walworth)

Not a lot to report at this time. Covid-19 has people afraid and hopes this doesn't influence people not to come to the convention in Chicago.

LDMS report (Rev. Ron Friedrich)

Updated the Executive Council on the statistics of Deaf • Ministry in the LCMS.

- LDMS Board is now taking up the deaf children's ٠ education project that was previously supported by ILDA.
 - Requested information on the 1971 convention to be given to Rev. Gehlbach. 2021 is the 50th Anniversary of ILDA, 150th Anniversary of Deaf Ministry in the LCMS and 50th Anniversary of Mill Neck Manor.

Deaf Lutheran Editor (Janet Gehlbach

- Brought up the issue of officer nominations not being ٠ put into the Deaf Lutheran any more.
- John Mason noted convention bids are to be • submitted four years in advance.

Deaf Lutheran Business Manager (Carolyn Snyder-Mason)

- The same number of people are renewing their subscriptions each year.
- Mailing labels now have a renewal date on them.
- Financial reports will be audited prior to the start of the 2021 Chicago convention.

- Letter and application form for mission projects 2021-2023 will be mailed out in January.
- Applications received will follow postmarked date. Paper applications will be accepted. No email applications will be accepted.
- It was suggested to combine the 2021 convention • registration packet to be mailed out in January to include the Right Hand Award application, Mission Project application and a copy of the ILDA membership form.

Right Hand Award (Dawn Werth)

It was suggested a signature line be added to the Right Hand Award nomination form to avoid fraud that someone would nominate themselves.

LDMS Archivist (Rev. Daryl Gehlbach)

- Planning to go to St. Louis to Concordia Historical • Institute (CHI) to do more research.
- Any important papers related to ILDA should be given to him before the Chicago convention.

2021 ILDA convention hosts (Janet and Rev. Daryl Gehlbach)

Asked David to assign a membership card number to ILDA members.

- Host committee is not fundraising. We are asking for donations from churches and individuals. So far have received \$12,300+ despite COVID-19 issues.
- Hotel food costs have gone up a lot so that's why we don't want to cancel the convention.
- Cancellation fee of \$50 is written into the registration form. Refunds given only through a doctor's note or death certificate.
- Need ideas for service projects.

Old Business: none

New Business:

- It was decided to wait until next year to decide about ILDA dissolution.
- John Mason picked a committee to draft a change to the Constitution regarding ILDA conventions. It will be put into the Winter issue (February 2021).
- John asked that a copy of the Constitution and a copy of the amendment and resolution be put into the registration packet for the 2021 convention.

• David announced he will be sending out ILDA membership forms soon for renewals.

Constitution Proposal for the ILDA Business Meeting, July 23, 2021

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS The International Lutheran Deaf Association Constitution, Article XI, states:

The ILDA shall hold conventions every two (2) years in odd numbered years. Regional branches are encouraged to meet in evennumbered years. The conduct as well as all plans, conditions and provisions shall be set forth in this Constitution and its Handbook. All of the ILDA conventions shall be self-supporting.

And WHEREAS the current ILDA convention schedule of meeting in odd-numbered years often conflicts with conventions of other national organizations which ILDA members attend, be it therefore

RESOLVED that Article XI of the Constitution be amended as follows:

The ILDA shall hold conventions every two (2) years in **even**-numbered years. Regional branches are encouraged to meet in **odd**-numbered years. The conduct as well as all plans, conditions and provisions shall be set forth in this Constitution and its Handbook. All of the ILDA conventions shall be self-supporting.

And be it finally RESOLVED that this change in the ILDA convention schedule begin three (3) years following the ratification of this amendment.
